

A Message From Our Pastor

Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as [children] of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church, and made sharers in her mission: "Baptism is the greatest sacrament of regeneration through water and in the word" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1213).

There is no wonder then, why baptismal fonts have always been central to our Christian churches. Although without any evidence, I suspect the original baptistery of St. Philip's was located under one of the bell towers where the bathrooms are now. A picture dated, May 4, 1981, shows the font near the St. Joseph altar, where the organ is currently sitting. Now we have our baptismal font with running water and immersion pool, and we have a leak.

Unfortunately, this leak is not new, and many attempts have been made to seal it over the decades. In an effort to save the current font, soon we will begin a project of chipping out the tile and creating a fiberglass shell for both the upper bowl and lower pool. We will then cover the fiber glass with stone or tile, so that our font does not look like a bathtub.

If the damage caused by the leak to the frame of the font and/or the floor of the church is more than expected and would necessitate the rebuilding of the structure, we will remove the current font altogether and proceed with a new baptismal font in a more traditional style without plumbing or running water.

At the center of this decision-making process is the preservation of both our church building and the living history of this parish, as well as the dignity of the sacrament of Baptism.
