



A Message From Our Pastor

Vacations have come to an end, summer break is over, students have returned to school, we should be ready to get back into our routines, but there always seems to be something that disrupts the rhythm of life. This past week, at least for me, it was the fire in town.

Sitting here at the rectory, seeing all the smoke billowing up over the tree line, I found myself like St. Peter and the Apostles who were in the boat during the storm last Sunday, asking, "Lord, do you not care?"
