

A Message From Our Pastor

It has been a busy week here in our parish! You might have noticed the new windows at the rectory. This project was begun before it was announced that I would be coming here to St. Philips to be your pastor, so thank you, Fr. Michael! Not only do they look great, but the energy efficiency has given the air conditioners a chance to actually cool the building and retain the cool air, bringing a welcomed relief from the heat for Fr. Samuel and I.

The sound-system project remains ongoing. Perhaps you have seen the eight speakers that have been installed, located in the windows of the church. There will be an additional eight speakers installed over the next few weeks while we wait for the motherboard, that remains back ordered. Please, pray with me that this last piece of equipment will arrive as they have promised, and we can be using our new system by the end of September.

You can see that the baptismal font project is underway. On Tuesday, we chipped out all the tile to expose any possible damage. Initially, we thought we had identified the leaks and that the wood substructure was generally intact. However, on Wednesday, discovery revealed that almost the entire pedestal that held the upper bowl was rotten. Rebuilding it would necessarily cause damage to the lower pool. And so, we have entered a new phase. Our first step was to remove the entire baptismal font and pool, a process that revealed additional and extensive water damage throughout the entire area, in and around the font. With it now gone and damage repaired, we can begin the discussion on how to move forward.

Lastly, on Thursday they installed carpet in the confessionals. Hopefully, with the carpeted floors and mounting some of the sounds, boards that used to be in the loft, onto the dividing walls, we can solve the acoustical problem in our confessionals.

This is our church, our place to encounter the living God in his Word and Sacrament, it was here before us, and will be here after us, so let us do our part to care for it, we are all in this together.


