



A Message From Our Pastor

As we prepare for the Solemnity of Christ the King, just three short weeks away, the day when we will once again use the tabernacle in the main body of our church, I wanted to take this opportunity to offer a few notes to help us approach our Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament, the Source and Summit of the Christian Faith.

Currently, the Catholic Church in the United States is in the third year of a National Eucharistic Revival. On the website, eucharisticrevival.org, they ask the question, "why now?" I think this question can also be asked about this move to the original tabernacle of our church, and I am convinced that the answer is the same, "because the Church [we] need healing, and the world needs Jesus." The Eucharist is the answer.

From the moment of the Consecration until after Holy Communion, the majority of the faithful who come to Mass at St. Philip's spend about 8-10 minutes a week in the presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, before the Eucharist is taken to the chapel. With this change, the time we will spend in the presence of our Lord and King will increase to nearly an hour each week.

Once the Eucharist is kept in the Church, we will all have to be more mindful of those signs of reverence and pious actions that have for centuries shaped Catholic devotion. First, remembering and respecting that many people will arrive early and stay after Mass to pray before the tabernacle, where Jesus waits for us, we will need to foster and maintain a sacred silence in the church. Additionally, as we enter and exit the pews, or cross through the center of the church, instead of bowing, if we are able, we should genuflect on our right knee, acknowledging the presence of the King of kings and Lord of lords in our midst. So often we wonder, we study, we search for the answers to life's toughest questions, forgetting that the answer has been with us the whole time, ever since the night of the Last Supper, "this is my Body, which will be given up for you."
