

A Message From Our Pastor

Our Gospel readings for the last several weeks have been a continuous reading of Mark's account of the life and ministry of Jesus. Most scripture scholars would agree that Mark's Gospel was the first to be written and in fact serves as the structure around which Matthew and Luke's narratives would be created. So then, what we are reading in these weeks in fundamental to the Christian's earliest understanding of who this Jesus is and what he came to do.

So, what have we seen so far? There has been a recognition of Jesus as something new, something different than the people had ever encountered before. There has been a call to come and follow him. There has been conversion. This weekend we witness healing. And next weekend Jesus will continue his work of restoration and rehabilitation with the healing of the leper. Then, our routine readings will be disrupted as we begin Lent.

But while we still are in our continuous reading of Mark, it is worth considering; how have I recognized Jesus in my life? How has he called me to come and follow him? How is he trying to deliver me from those bad habits and sins that hold me back from being fully alive? Where is he trying to offer me healing in my life? How is he trying to restore my dignity and worth?

Mark moves fast and with urgency. We should receive and respond in kind.
