*Fourth Sunday of Lent**March 10, 2024***A Message From Our Parochial Vicar**

There is no doubt that the season of Lent offers us the opportune time to do penance in reparation for our sins through prayer, fasting, self-denial, almsgiving and other good works. This is not to bore you with what you already know, but to remind myself of the fact that time and days move so fast that I may tend to overlook what I am observing so far to improve my spiritual life in this season of grace.

All too soon, we are already in the 4th Sunday of Lent, when the church nevertheless sets aside this day to express our anticipated joy in Christ's resurrection. This Sunday is known as "*Laetare Sunday*," taken from the Latin word, meaning "*Rejoice*." On this day, the Priest wears a rose garment instead of the usual purple color in Lent to express this symbolism of joy in the midst of penance.

With only a couple of weeks left to celebrate the passion, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ at Easter, I am reminded once again to intensify my preparations with some more spiritual exercises if I have not been consistent with them already. This is why I find the following everyday Lenten inspirations worth-sharing: For example, I need to remind myself that today if someone hurts me, I will not respond in a like manner, rather I will do my best to pray for them and forgive them. I will carefully choose and guard my words; I will find ways to reach out and bless the life of someone; I will treat others the same way I wish to be treated; I will nurture my body; I will spend more time praying and observe some quiet time in my life among other things.

Thanks to you all for allowing me to come your way and also to my Pastor, Fr. Dalton, for this opportunity. With the tender care and compassion of our loving Savior,

FIRST READING - Jeremiah 31:31-34

The days are coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant I made with their fathers the day I took them by the hand to lead them forth from the land of Egypt; for they broke my covenant, and I had to show myself their master, says the LORD. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD. I will place my law within them and write it upon their hearts; I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer will they have need to teach their friends and relatives how to know the LORD. All, from least to greatest, shall know me, says the LORD, for I will forgive their evildoing and remember their sin no more.

SECOND READING - Hebrews 5:7-9

In the days when Christ Jesus was in the flesh, he offered prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverence. Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he suffered; and when he was made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him.

GOSPEL - John 12:20-33

Some Greeks who had come to worship at the Passover Feast came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we would like to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me. "I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again." The crowd there heard it and said it was thunder; but others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered and said, "This voice did not come for my sake but for yours. Now is the time of judgment on this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself." He said this indicating the kind of death he would die.

Key Scriptural Passage...

Jesus said to Nicodemus, "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:17)

Questions for Discussion:

Adult: Do you see the world as basically evil, or as good? What difference does this make in the way you live?
Child: Where do you see goodness in God's world?

Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving...The Three Pillars of Lent... The solemn season of Lent is marked by three pillars of spiritual practice: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Lent recalls the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert, battling temptation. We, too, walk through the desert this season as we struggle with our temptations to sin. We pray more in Lent so as to strengthen our relationship with God and ask his forgiveness for our shortcomings. We fast as a reminder of how hungry we are for God's everlasting love. We give alms to people in need to follow Christ's command to feed the hungry and clothe the naked.

Growing in Faith.....Preparing hearts for Easter joy...

Lent is the Church's gift to us to help prepare our hearts for Easter by purifying our hearts, opening up to love, and putting love into action.

Purifying our hearts: Every heart yearns for love, yet only God's love can truly satisfy that yearning. The goal of Lenten penance is to purify ourselves of whatever blocks us from God's love or closes our heart to others. This can include excessive social media, materialism, gossip, or sinful habits that lust or deceit. From what does your heart need to detach so there's room for God and others?

Opening up to love: Mother Teresa wrote, "Have you seen... how (Jesus) looks at you with love?... Have you heard the loving words He speaks to you?" Strive to know God's heart. Seek Him, not just His gifts. Only by receiving God's love first, beginning with prayer, can we share it with others.

Put love in action: "Even as I have loved you...you also love one another." (John 13:34) God commands us to love as we've been loved, because we are loved. Find small, doable ways to serve during Lent. Commit to a Work of Mercy (corporal or spiritual.) Practice patience. Give the gift of listening. True joy at Easter comes from loving Christ and imitating Him. Strive to do this throughout Lent and beyond.


