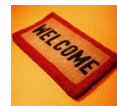
Welcome

Election of Godparents: One Godparent is required. Two Godparents—one male, one female may be appointed. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, 16 years of age or older, fully initiated into the Church (Baptized and Confirmed) at least 6 months before baptism. A non-Catholic may stand as a Christian Witness. Former Catholics are ineligible. Godparents must obtain a *Certificate of Eligibility* from their pastor; Christian Witnesses must provide a copy of their baptismal record. These documents and baptismal stipend must be received by the parish office one week before the day of Baptism.

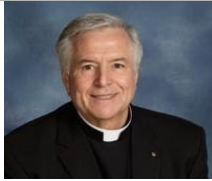

Christ is Risen, Alleluia! Truly, He is Risen, Alleluia!

One of the Easter Sunday Scripture passages (Colossians 3: 1-4) reads like this: ***“If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory.”***

What does this Easter Scripture passage mean for us? After all, Easter commemorates Christ’s Resurrection from the dead. This passage seems to say that we too, as Christ’s followers have died and have been raised, and somehow in Christ, we are sharing in His heavenly life.

Christ is raised from the dead, but how have we been raised with him?

Bible accounts of the Resurrection, Jesus’ appearances after the Resurrection, and the “goings-on” of the Early Church (The Acts of the Apostles would be a good post-Easter read), reveal a change, a transformation in Christ’s followers:

Their sorrow turned to joy; their doubt to faith; their despair to hope; their fear to courage and zeal for the Lord; their division to unity; their ignorance to enlightenment by the Holy Spirit.

Timid, fearful, scattered Apostles in hiding became leaders willing to give their lives for Jesus. In a certain sense then, they too had been raised from the dead.

Jesus loves each of us just as much as His first disciples so He desires the same change for us; to raise us up to all that we can be in Christ. Because of Jesus’ suffering, death, and Resurrection, we have died to sin and have been raised with Christ in Baptism. Consequently, Easter should have the same dramatic impact on us now as it did on Jesus’ disciples then.

In celebrating Christ’s Resurrection from the dead today, we have an opportune time to ask ourselves what the Resurrection means to us?

- Is Easter not only a happy ending to Jesus’ suffering and death, but also a new beginning for us?
- Is the Resurrection changing us? Are we undergoing a death that causes us to rise to a new way of life in Christ?

Jesus’ Resurrection means we can change and grow into a life that has one foot in Heaven, so to speak. When we unite ourselves to Jesus, we inherit the grace-filled results. We grow in His likeness and His ability to serve others. We become more like Him.

Our raised-up life on earth means pride, anger, jealousy, greed, resentment, indifference, and lust no longer control us and make us unhappy. Rather, we can experience this heavenly life on earth, living a resurrected life of charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, and chastity.

Because of Jesus’ life, death and resurrection, God resurrects us into His very own life; a life meant to be lived in imitation of Jesus. Our resurrection begins in this new life in Christ and, if we allow it, grows throughout our lifetime on earth.

This, my friends, is Easter lived each day of our lives through a new life in Jesus Christ, our Resurrection and our life.

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John's Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. ***On an average day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.***



The casseroles are the "Main Course" of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God's poor and homeless who come to St. John's for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John's provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard "half tray". Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John's picks up the dishes from our freezer.

Here are some useful hints:

- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic "spork" (a combination spoon and fork).
- Please mark the lid with the main ingredients and date you prepared your casserole.

A Journey through Latin Percussion



Holy Rosary students in grades kindergarten through eighth were treated recently to an assembly by Young Audiences of New Jersey and Eastern Pennsylvania. We were fortunate to be blessed with a grant for this show. The students spent the afternoon enjoying a dynamic presentation performance called "Samba to Salsa." They were introduced to a variety of Latin and Brazilian percussion instruments. The students learned how these instruments are used to communicate. "Drum language" is universal and can connect people. They also learned how music is a vital means of preserving social history and cultural heritage. The students kept the beat with their hands thumping their laps, swinging through the air, and drumming the floor. There was not a still body in the house!

Welcome Grant

Holy Rosary will offer a Welcome Grant of \$1,000 to any student who is presently in our kindergarten and attending first grade or any new incoming first grader for the 2022-2023 school year.

Transfer Grant

Any student who transfers to Holy Rosary in grades 2-7 from a non-Catholic school for the 2022-2023 school year will be eligible for a Transfer Grant of \$1,000. Please contact us for a tour.

REGISTRATION NOW OPEN FOR 2022 – 2023

Age Requirements:

- Pre-Kindergarten: Age 4 by September 1, 2022
- Kindergarten: Age 5 by September 1, 2022
- First Grade: Age 6 by September 1, 2022

Registration is now open for the school year 2022-2023. To complete the application process, the parent/guardian will need to provide copies of the following:

- Birth Certificate
- Certificate of Baptism
- If your child has received additional sacraments, we must have their complete dates
- Immunization Record
- K-8 Registration Fee – \$125 per student (nonrefundable)
- Pre-K4 Registration Fee - \$125 per student (nonrefundable - includes supplies and snacks for the year)
