

Election of Godparents: One Godparent is required. Two Godparentsone male, one female may be appointed. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, 16 years of age or older, fully initiated into the Church (Baptized and Confirmed) at least 6 months before baptism. A non-Catholic may stand as a Christian Witness. Former Catholics are ineligible. Godparents must obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their pastor; Christian Witnesses must provide a copy of their baptismal record. These documents and baptismal stipend must be received by the parish office one week before the day of Baptism.

Eucharistic Revival

This year's celebration of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord, on June 19, 2022, also marks the inauguration of a three-year National Eucharistic Revival called for by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). The goal of the Eucharistic Revival is to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. To this end, we pray for the success of this revival, asking all of you to pray the following two prayers daily, which the three visionaries received at Fatima from the angel:

My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love Thee! I ask pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love Thee. (Pray three times)

Most Holy Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit- I adore Thee profoundly. I offer Thee the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges, and indifferences whereby He is offended. And through the infinite merits of His Most Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg of Thee the conversion of poor sinners. Our Lady of Fatima, pray for us.





Deacon Claude's Reflection: Praying with Jesus (Part 2)

Last week we began a reflection on the Gospel reading from John (17: 20-26) for that Sunday. We see Jesus praying to the Father. Accordingly, we began to consider imitating Jesus in prayer by pondering His words; what he prayed; and how His words could guide our prayer in our specific life circumstances.

The following Gospel verses offer reflections that might help develop and amplify our prayers. Please keep in mind that Jesus' words might speak to You differently than they do in these reflections. Go where the Holy Spirit takes you in prayer!

"And I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one" (John 17: 22) What is the glory the Father gave to Jesus? If we link to John 17: 1, it is Jesus' "hour." The hour of His Passion and death. His glory comes to fulfillment with His Resurrection and Ascension. So the tragedy of the Cross is Jesus' glory, as is the obedience that brings Him to the Cross. In turn, by Jesus' Cross and Resurrection, Jesus shares His glory with us.

So what might our response be? Sharing in Jesus' Cross by joining our daily crosses, no matter how small, with His Cross of suffering. Joining our sorrows, burdens, difficulties, tragedies, and tears to Jesus' Cross. Praying that as Jesus was resurrected, one day Jesus will resurrect us, soul then body; one with Him as He is with the Father, sharing in eternal glory.

We can also think about Jesus' glory that He revealed outside of the context of 17: 1, like His miracles: raising Lazarus and the widow's son from the dead; calming the stormy sea as the disciples were afraid; Jesus' healings and exorcisms; His Transfiguration on the mountain; the miracle of loaves and fishes; the Holy Eucharist. All these miracles reflect the glory that is His love. Let us thank the Lord for loving us and love him in return. May we trust in Jesus because of the faith we have in His miracle-working power.

"I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me." (23)

In Jesus' words, we see a divine indwelling; the Father in Jesus, and Jesus the Son in the Father. By the life of sanctifying grace that Jesus won for us, our prayer could be that such divine indwelling will be the same for us. That you and I as Catholic, Christian disciples dwell in Jesus and therefore in the Father.

This divine intimacy to which we are called, if we are open to it and seek it by faith, brings us to perfection. Meditate on Jesus' words, "Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5: 48). And what is this perfection? Let us consider that it is love, for God is love (1 John 4: 8). Love, self-forgetful, self-sacrificing love, is the theme of Jesus' prayer.

There lies our perfection, which we can accomplish by the divine love of God within us. Such love, by the power of the Holy Spirit, wipes out our selfishness; wipes out our pride and makes us humble; wipes out our excessive self-interest and seeing ourselves as number one, and makes us self-sacrificing. In other words, makes us more like Jesus, who is the image of the Father, in human form. May our prayers be for this divine intimacy with the Father, through Jesus in the power of the Holy Spirit. May we live in God's love and share God's love with all.

May we also thank the Father for desiring for us to share in His saving plan to participate in this divine intimacy with the Holy Trinity and for Jesus taking away our sins so that we can share in this eternal communion.

"Father, they are your gift to me. I wish that where I am they also may be with me, that they may see my glory that you gave me, because you loved me before the foundation of the world" (24).

Think about how much Jesus loves you and me when He considers us as the Father's gift to Him. Not only that, but He also went to the extreme of torture, suffering and death to prove it, so that we can dwell with Him now and eternally in the heart of the Father. Our prayer can be one of thanks for Jesus wanting us to be there with Him. We can also pray for our families, and all those we know that they too may share this divine intimacy and be embraced in the divine life of the Holy Trinity.

We will continue next week with succeeding passages from John 17: 20-26. Why not read the passage yourself, slowly contemplating each verse, allowing the Holy Spirit to speak to you and how Jesus may be guiding your prayer through His prayer?

St. Titus Outreach Program

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John's Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. *On an average day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.*

The casseroles are the "Main Course" of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God's poor and homeless who come to St. John's for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John's provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard "half tray". Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John's picks up the dishes from our freezer.



- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic "spork" (a combination spoon and fork).
- Please mark the lid with the main ingredients and date you prepared your casserole.
