Election of Godparents: One Godparent is required. Two Godparents—one male, one female may be appointed. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, 16 years of age or older, fully initiated into the Church (Baptized and Confirmed) at least 6 months before baptism. A non-Catholic may stand as a Christian Witness. Former Catholics are ineligible. Godparents must obtain a *Certificate of Eligibility* from their pastor; Christian Witnesses must provide a copy of their baptismal record. These documents and baptismal stipend must be received by the parish office one week before the day of Baptism.

Eucharistic Revival Prayers

My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love Thee! I ask pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love Thee. (Pray three times)

I offer Thee the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges, and indifferences whereby He is offended. And through the infinite merits of His Most Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg of Thee the conversion of poor sinners. Our Lady of Fatima, pray for us.

NIC NOTES

Our parish is alive and well! Yet, we need always to strive to be all that God wants us to be. When you take ownership in your parish in the fullest sense by your active interest, we, as a parish, grow and prosper. When we see the parish for what it truly is, we do become more welcoming and alive.

Next weekend, we will celebrate our Patronal Feast of Saint Titus. We will celebrate his Mass and have "Hospitality" - light refreshments after all of the weekend Masses.

Deacon Claude's Reflection for the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

At Mass, we repeatedly hear these words from The Preface: "It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through Christ our Lord."

This makes sense doesn't it? After all, don't we owe God thanks, praise, homage, and worship since without God, we would have no existence; we would be nothing?

But here's the thing...We are human, fallen, and tending toward our self-interests. Often, we come to Mass distracted; worrying about what needs to be done; the "to do" list; sports and outdoor activities on a nice sunny day, etc.

Faced with such distractions, we might help ourselves to prepare for Mass by focusing our minds and hearts on the worship we are about to give to God. One thing we could do to point us in the right direction is to read over the Scriptures for the Mass; read a reflection or commentary; and pray with it.

"Listen attentively to God's word. The Liturgy of the Word is intrinsically linked with and prepares us for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. To know Christ in and through His word is to love Him better, and the more we love Him the better prepared we are to put all our faith and trust in Him when He becomes present in the Eucharist..." **(What Does It Mean to "host" Jesus in the Eucharist? Rev. Charles Fox Catholic World Report 8/14/22)**

Let me suggest what I think is one of many excellent daily Mass reflections and a starting point for prayer and worship. This one comes from Regnum Christi:

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 13:22-30

Introductory Prayer: I believe in you, my God. You called me into existence from nothingness and carefully watch over me. You have even numbered the hairs of my head. I trust in your infinite goodness, and I abandon into your loving hands my fears, my hopes, my needs, my desires, everything. I love you, Lord, and wish to love you with all my mind, heart, soul, and strength.

Petition: I shall not fear for my salvation, but grow in confidence in you, my God.

Salvation: A Numbers Racket? We never stop asking the question the person in the Gospel asked Jesus. If we don't achieve eternal life, nothing else we have attained in life matters. Jesus does not give the answer we might want to hear: that many are saved, and salvation is a sure and simple thing to reach. Instead, he warns us against presumption in this matter. As Saint Paul later said, "Work out your salvation in fear and trembling" (Phil 2:12). It is something we need to take with the utmost seriousness. Every day we need to pray for the grace to persevere to the end. We need to live each day with the perspective that it could be our last. We need to go back to the venerable tradition of praying for a "happy death."

Narrow Gates: When Jesus speaks of the narrow gate, he is saying that salvation is not a birthright or something guaranteed. It depends on our active cooperation with his grace—the real effort to love God and follow his will. "If you love me, you will keep my commandments" (Jn 14:15). Jesus warned that not everyone who cries out, "Lord, Lord..." will enter the Kingdom of heaven, but those who do the will of his Father in heaven. Obedience to God's will is the best assurance we can have of our salvation. What is there in my life that is not in accord with his will?

Judge Not: We might also be surprised that those from "the east and the west" will enter the Kingdom before many others. We might be surprised at those who are saved. Salvation is not a privilege of a race or a chosen people. It is a matter of how we respond in freedom to grace and the invitation of the Lord to a certain way of life. We shouldn't give in to judging where others stand; we should only attend to our own soul. Are we at peace with God in our conscience? Can we be sure we are objective about our own situation in God's eyes? Our conscience should be clear, and we should make sure we are serene and have peace of soul. If we find there is something between us and God's will, we should go to confession and pray for the grace to change.

Conversation with Christ: Lord, give me the grace to know your will and the discernment to know if there is anything in my soul that is keeping me from you. Help me to overcome any obstacle, so that I may be one with you and that your will may be my guide every day.

Resolution: I will make frequent confession a habit and every day examine my conscience to seek union and peace with the Lord. **(Copyright 2019, Legion of Christ. All rights reserved <https://www.regnumchristi.org/en/daily-meditation/>)**

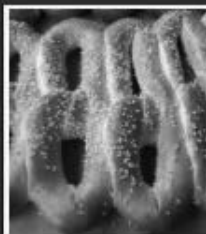

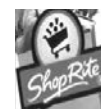

**ST. TITUS PREP NEWS**

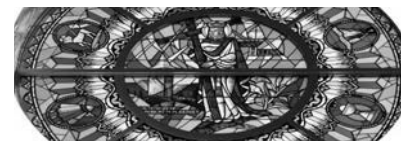

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John's Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. ***On an average day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.***

The casseroles are the "Main Course" of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God's poor and homeless who come to St. John's for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John's provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard "half tray". Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John's picks up the dishes from our freezer.



Here are some useful hints:

- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic "spork" (a combination spoon and fork).
- Please mark the lid with the main ingredients and date you prepared your casserole.

3. Mail your envelopes in or drop them off at the Parish Office, Monday-Friday, 9am-4pm.

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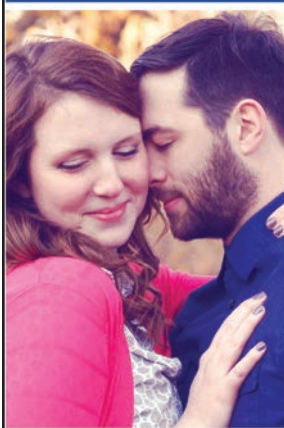
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
