SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Schedule with Parish Office for any Sunday at 11:15am. Baptisms are not performed on holidays. Pre-Jordan classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm in the St. Helena Convent. Call the Parish Office to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia requires that all couples attend Pre Cana class before marriage. At this time, we ask you to go to Archphil.org under Marriage preparations to take the class online.

ANointing OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. **To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office during regular hours at 610-279-4990.**

Mass Cards and Candles in honor of the living or in memory of the deceased are available at the Parish Office.

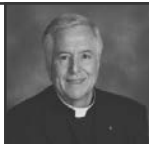

Dear Parishioners,

We are now in the month of October.

Traditionally, this month is dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. The Rosary is a devotional prayer. The Our Father is scriptural, as well as, the first half of the Hail Mary is scriptural. The Holy Mysteries of the Rosary are also scriptural. As an individual and/or family, it would be absolutely wonderful to incorporate the praying of the Rosary and making it a family tradition. Even praying one decade of the Rosary would be great. As a parish, the Rosary is publicly prayed after the 8:45am Mass on Monday, Tuesday, Friday, and Saturday. The Rosary is also prayed publicly before the 4:30pm Saturday evening Mass. The Rosary is a wonderful "weapon" against the devil. It is also considered a lifeline/chain/ladder to heaven.

October 7, is the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. In 1571, the first Sunday in October was October 7. Pope Pius V asked that the Rosary be prayed for victory. It was at Lepanto, that there was a great naval battle, in which there was a naval victory over the Turks, who were attacking them. Don Juan of Austria lead the battle. In thanksgiving for this victory, which was attributed to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin through the praying of the Holy Rosary, Pope St. Pius V instituted the annual feast of Our Lady of Victory. His immediate successor, Pope Gregory the XIII changed the title to Our Lady of the Rosary.

Let us do everything we can to continue to assist our parish and build up our community. Please don't forget the programs we have for the sixth, seventh, and eighth grade girls and boys, as well as, the Return program. Also, if you are interested in Walking With Purpose, which is a program for women based on Scripture, please call St. Helena Rectory (610-275-7711). There are two different tracks to this program. One is on Monday evening at 7pm and the other, is on Thursday afternoons at 12:45pm in the Convent at St. Helena. Registration is need for this program.

Deacon Claude's Corner-Job and Suffering

This week we have heard from the Book of Job at daily Mass. Job, one of my favorite Old Testament books, deals with the problem of suffering, in particular the innocent who suffer.

God describes Job as "blameless and upright, fearing God and avoiding evil" (Job 1: 8). Job is faithful, devout, and loyal. He is wise and wealthy and has a large and happy family. Satan proposes to God that if it were not for Job's comfort and wealth, he would not be so faithful.

God allows Job to be tested and Job loses everything. His children-killed; his wealth-wiped out. He is filled with boils. Three friends who came to console Job, blame Job's misfortunes and woes on the sins he must have committed.

What kind of support does Job's bitter wife give him? She says to Job, "Are you still holding to your innocence? Curse God and die" (Job 2: 9)! In chapter 3, we see Job's despair; it is better for him to never have been born.

Job continually defends his innocence. "In response to Job's plea that he be allowed to see God and hear directly the reason for his suffering, the Lord answers (Job 38:1-42:6), not by explaining divine justice, but by cataloguing the wonders of creation. Job is apparently content with this..." (*Introduction to the Book of Job, USCCB*). Job humbly responds to God, "I have spoken but did not understand; things too marvelous for me, which I did not know. By hearsay I had heard of you, but now my eye has seen you. Therefore I disown what I have said, and repent in dust and ashes (*Job 42: 3. 5-6*).

As I revisited the Book of Job, I wondered if it really answered the question about suffering, "Why does God allow suffering, especially the suffering of the innocent?" If I may speak out of both sides of my mouth, I would say, "**No, but yes.**" **No**, because suffering is a mystery that God allows. In faith, we know this, but we cannot understand why.

Yes, because suffering is as mysterious as God is, and who can understand the mind of God? Spoiler alert...This is the conclusion of the Book of Job. God's ways are not our ways. The Creator of all knows what is best and in particular what is best for each of us.

In his book, *Making Sense Out of Suffering*, Peter Kreeft, offers that while we cannot understand the mystery of suffering, we believe that God has entered our suffering in the person of His Son Jesus, who is the perfect example of innocent suffering. Our Lord and God becomes one of us, takes on our sins, and suffers along with us. Kreeft calls Jesus, "the tears of God."

Another book on suffering that I strongly recommend is *The Problem of Pain* by C.S. Lewis. Lastly, here is a very good article you might like, *Ten Lessons on Suffering from the Book of Job*:

Let us pray: Behold me, my beloved Jesus, weighed down under the burden of my trials and sufferings, I cast myself at Your feet, that You may renew my strength and my courage, while I rest here in Your Presence. Permit me to lay down my cross in Your Sacred Heart, for only Your infinite goodness can sustain me; only Your love can help me bear my cross; only Your powerful hand can lighten its weight.

O Divine King, Jesus, whose heart is so compassionate to the afflicted, I wish to live in You; suffer and die in You.

During my life be to me my model and my support; at the hour of my death, be my hope and my refuge. Amen. (*St. Therese Lisieux*)

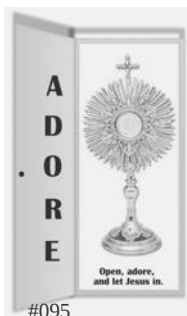

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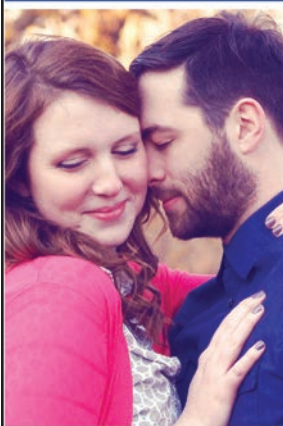
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
