Baptisms are not performed on holidays. Pre-Jordan classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm in the St. Helena Convent. Call the Parish Office to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia requires that all couples attend Pre Cana class before marriage. At this time, we ask you to go to Archphil.org under Marriage preparations to take the class online.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. **To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office during regular hours at 610-279-4990.**

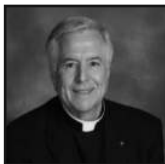

NIC NOTES

Dear Parishioners,
Advent has a way of being lost, partly because of the rush preceding Christmas and our understanding of Advent. It is too narrow to simply say that it is the time to prepare for the feast of the Lord's birth. It is true that it looks ahead to December 25; however, this look ahead is only a process by which true believers can look forward to their own ultimate meeting with God through Christ in eternity, and by which the world can look ahead to the ultimate fulfillment of the redemption in Christ, Our Savior. Advent cannot be separated from Christmas. Soon after Constantine, the Roman Emperor, son of St. Helena, ended the legal restraints against Christianity, there soon developed a series of public manifestations of Christian devotion. Among these devotions was a celebration of Jesus's birth. The date, December 25, neither then, nor now, was an attempt to insist that this date was the actual date. Yet, December 25 is the date since the third century A.D. to celebrate Christ's birth.



The customs of Christmas are a major celebration for the faithful rules for observing Christmas. These preparations were not just pragmatic; there are also spiritual. Early on, fasting came to be associated with preparation. In the year 490 A.D. in Tours, France, people fasted three days each week from November 11 to December 25. This custom spread to what is now Spain and Germany. In the sixth

century A.D., a more formal period of preparing for Christmas was established in Rome. upon the four or five Sundays preceding December 25. The custom there was to mark the preparation for the Feast of Christ's Birth by concentrating upon the four or five Sundays preceding December 25. Here fasting was not part of the process. The Roman celebration was festive and celebratory. Some years later the French adopted what had become the Roman ritual, but the mood was more somber. Gradually, the two traditions merged. The Roman Christians adopted the French practice of Penance. The French adopted the Roman Liturgies. By the 13th century, this blending of practices was complete. Over the centuries, Advent developed with a variety of traditions and many are still with us.

Remember, December 8 is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a Holyday of obligation. The Holyday Mass will be at 10am.

You are cordially invited to attend the ***Lighting of the Christmas Tree at St. Helena immediately following the 7pm Vigil Mass on December 7.*** There will be light refreshments and caroling. All are invited. ***The holyday schedule at St. Helena is 7pm Vigil Mass on December 7 and 9am and 12:15pm on December 8.***

Deacon Claude's Corner— A New Liturgical Year

The First Sunday of Advent began a new Church liturgical year. Over the course of a year, through signs, symbols, and the sacred arts, the Lord's mysteries unfold... from Advent to Pentecost, and finally to the feast of Christ the King. 'The liturgical year, devotedly fostered and accompanied by the Church, is not a cold and lifeless representation of the events of the past, or a simple and bare record of a former age,' writes Pius XII; 'it is rather Christ Himself who is ever living in His Church' (Pius XII, *Mediator Dei*, #165)." (*The Church's Year of Grace in Catholic Education*, by Sr. Joan L. Roccasalvo, C.S.J., *Catholic News Agency*, October 3, 2014)

I like to think of the liturgical year as a continual family celebration, beginning especially with Jesus' saving life, death, Resurrection and Ascension made present as we worship, through the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. As believers, we also come together to celebrate as a family the birthdays (unto eternal life) of the saints who modeled Jesus and who have given us examples to follow.

Active and whole-hearted participation in the liturgy, helps us grow in holiness. Pope Pius XII wrote, "By commemorating the mysteries of the Savior, the sacred liturgy strives to bring all believers to participate in them in such a way that the divine Head of the Mystical Body may live in each of His members with the fullness of His holiness" (*Mediator Dei*, #152).

Of course, what would a new liturgical year be without New Year's resolution? I would like to propose that we also make our new liturgical year, a year of prayer, by examining how, when and for how long we pray, and see if we have room for growth in our prayer life. If prayer is about getting to know God intimately, following His will for our life, and growing in holiness, wouldn't we want to pray as well and as often (within human reason and responsibility of course) as possible?

Here is what Saint Angela of Foligno wrote about prayer: "No one can be saved without divine light. Divine light causes us to begin and to make progress, and it leads us to the summit of perfection. Therefore if you want to begin and to receive this divine light, pray. If you have begun to make progress and want this light to be intensified within you, pray. And if you have reached the summit of perfection and want to be illumined so as to remain in that state, pray.

If you want faith, pray. If you want hope, pray. If you want charity, pray. If you want poverty, pray. If you want obedience, pray. If you want chastity, pray. If you want humility, pray. If you want meekness, pray. If you want fortitude, pray. If you want some virtue, pray. And pray in this fashion, namely, always reading the Book of Life, that is, the life of the God-man Jesus Christ, whose life consisted of poverty, pain, contempt, and true obedience." NEW MISSALS & NEW PARISH PRAYER

St. Titus Parish will debut new Missals for church on the weekend of November 26-27 which marks the beginning of the 2023 Liturgical Year and the 1st Sunday of Advent. Additionally, we will adopt a new Parish Prayer that will be recited at the beginning of each Mass at St. Titus. The new missal is titled ***Breaking Bread*** and is a softcover issue inserted into sturdy plastic covers. The missal covers to the full liturgical year with the full readings for all Sundays of the year, holydays and other special feast, as well as, the propers for all weekday Masses. A large selection of hymns is also contained in these books. The new Parish Prayer will be inserted inside the front cover of each missal ready to be recited at the start of Holy Mass.

The old books will be collected from the pews and any with a family name in it will be made available for your to retrieve.

The new books will be kept in 2 bookcases—one on each side of the back of church and you will be asked to pick one up on your way into church for use at Mass. All Missals are to be returned to the bookcases following use.

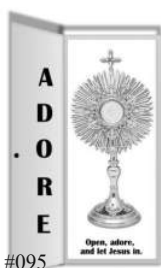
