SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Schedule with Parish Office for any Sunday at 11:15am. Baptisms are not performed on holidays. Pre-Jordan classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm in the St. Helena Convent. Call the Parish Office to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia requires that all couples attend Pre Cana class before marriage. At this time, we ask you to go to Archphil.org under Marriage preparations to take the class online.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. **To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office during regular hours at 610-279-4990.**

NIC NOTES

Dear Parishioners,
Technically speaking with the new revised Roman calendar, the Christmas Season ends with the Baptism of the Lord. Since we are still in this season of Christmas, I would like to share with you the true meaning of one of the Christmas treats with which you are very familiar.



The Christmas Candy Cane

A candy maker in Indiana wanted to make a candy that in a special way would show people the love of God at Christmas. He used several symbols for the Birth, Ministry and Death of Jesus Christ.

He began with a stick of pure white hard candy – *White* to symbolize the virgin birth and the sinless nature of Jesus, and *Hard* to symbolize the firmness of the promises of God and Christ as the Solid Rock Foundation of the Church.

The candy maker formed the candy in the shape of a “J” to represent the precious name of Jesus, Who came to earth as our Savior! He felt the shape could also represent the staff of the “Good Shepherd” with which He reaches down into the ditches of the world to lift up the fallen sheep who, like us, have gone astray.

The candy maker stained the white candy with Red stripes. Red stripes reminded him of Jesus. They represent the scourging Jesus received and the blood He shed on the Cross. Why is that important? Because the Bible says it is by the Precious Blood of Jesus that we can have forgiveness of our sins and an everlasting home in heaven.

Over time, the special candy became known as the Candy Cane – a delight seen just at Christmas time. But the meaning is still there for those who “have eyes to see and ears to hear.” My hope is that now whenever you see a candy cane, you will be reminded of Jesus and the things God wants you to know.

Hopefully every time you see a candy cane or eat one, you will remember its origin. Like most traditions that surround Christmas, this has a special meaning. But, like most things special, it somehow gets separated and ends up no longer religious, but secular. Please do all you can in your own family to keep Christ in Christmas. Remember that saying Merry Christmas to someone is not only a beautiful greeting or sentiment, it is evangelization in action. Merry Christmas really has everything to do with Christ.

May God, through the intercession of St. Titus, bless us!

Deacon Claude's Corner— What's in a Name?

"Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus" (Luke 1:31).

"If you ask the Father anything in my name he will give it you" (John 16: 23).

"... in the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those that are in heaven, on earth, and under the earth" (Philippians 2: 10).

The Church dedicates the month of January to honoring the Most Holy Name of Jesus, and normally, the specific day of January 3. Perhaps this could serve as motivation for us to learn more about Jesus' name and reverence it; that through his name, we might understand Jesus more, grow closer to him and deepen our prayer life.

Normally, we hear Jesus proclaimed as "Jesus Christ." "Jesus" is our Savior's name, and "Christ" is a title, meaning Messiah or Anointed One. This could also be written, "Jesus, the Christ."

The angel Gabriel carried out God the Father's will and told Joseph to give Jesus His name. "Jesus" reflects both His identity and mission. "Jesus" means "God saves." So God (identity) comes among us to save us (mission). In Matthew 1: 21 we read, "...you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (431, 434, 435) explains, "...the divine name that alone brings salvation, and henceforth all can invoke his name, for Jesus united himself to all men through his Incarnation, so that 'there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.'

Jesus' Resurrection glorifies the name of the Savior God, ... the name of Jesus that fully manifests the supreme power of the 'name which is above every name.' The evil spirits fear his name; in his name his disciples perform miracles, for the Father grants all they ask in this name.

The name of Jesus is at the heart of Christian prayer. All liturgical prayers conclude with the words "through our Lord Jesus Christ." The Hail Mary reaches its high point in the words "blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus."

JESUS

Many Catholics and non-Catholic Christians believe by using the formula, "I (we) ask this through Christ our Lord" or "In Jesus' name I (we) pray," that such formulas will guarantee our prayer will be answered the way we want. However, what does it really mean to "ask the Father anything in my name he will give it you (John 15: 16)?" I like the answer to this that Reverend Mark Roberts gave in his blog on Patheos: "All Christians pray in Jesus's name, and only in Jesus' name, in that we approach God under the authority of Jesus and, if you will, by his permission and because of his effort on our behalf. We come before God's throne of grace, not in our own merit, but in the merit of Jesus. Ideally, when we pray in Jesus' name, not only are we approaching God in the authority of Jesus, but also we are coming with Jesus' own desires.

So, when I ... pray 'in Jesus' name,' ... I hope that my prayers are also consistent with his will, though I recognize that my own agenda can intrude into my prayers fairly easily. Yet my desire is to bring my prayers more and more in line with what Jesus desires."

Reading, Reflection and Prayer:

- Say and pray the name of Jesus with a special reverence, respect, and love.
- Get back to the "old time" tradition of bowing your head when you hear the name of Jesus.
- Say Jesus' name repeatedly as a way of praising him and when you are worried, anxious, sorrowful, and hurting and avoid using it in vain, such as when angry.
- Pray the Jesus Prayer: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner."
- Read and meditate on some Scripture passages mentioning the name of Jesus such as: Matt. 10:22; 18: 20; 24: 9; Mark 9:37-39; John 14:13-14; Acts 3: 6, 16 4:10-18; 1 Cor. 1:2, 10; 6:11; Col. 3:17; Philippians 2: 10-11.
- Pray the Litany of the Holy Name of Jesus.

The new missal is titled ***Breaking Bread*** and is a softcover issue inserted into sturdy plastic covers. The missal covers to the full liturgical year with the full readings for all Sundays of the year, holydays and other special feast, as well as, the propers for all weekday Masses. A large selection of hymns is also contained in these books. The new Parish Prayer is inserted inside the front cover of each missal ready to be recited at the start of Holy Mass.

The old books have been collected from the pews and any with a family name in it will be made available for your to retrieve. Contact the office if interested.

The new books will be kept in 2 bookcases—one on each side of the back of church and you will be asked to pick one up on your way into church for use at Mass. All Missals are to be returned to the bookcases following use.

contrition, purity and faith.***

***May it advance the Salvation of my soul
so that I may be counted among Your chosen.***

***O, most loving Father, grant me your
beloved Son,***

***whom I now receive veiled in this
Sacrament, so to behold His Face
at last revealed.***

Amen.

***St. Michael the Archangel, usher of God's
mercy and protector against terrorism, pray
for us.***



ST. TITUS OUTREACH PROGRAM

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John's Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. **On an average day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.**

The casseroles are the "Main Course" of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God's poor and homeless who come to St. John's for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John's provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard "half tray". Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John's picks up the dishes from our freezer.

Here are some useful hints:

- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic "spork" (a combination spoon and fork).
- Please mark the lid with the main ingredients and date you prepared your casserole.
