SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Schedule with Parish Office for any Sunday at 11:15am. Baptisms are not performed on holidays. Pre-Jordan classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm in the St. Helena Convent. Call the Parish Office to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia requires that all couples attend Pre Cana class before marriage. At this time, we ask you to go to Archphil.org under Marriage preparations to take the class online.

ANointING OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. **To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office during regular hours at 610-279-4990.**

Deacon Claude's Corner— The Baptism of Jesus

In this liturgical year, we celebrated the Baptism of the Lord on January 9, hearing St. Matthew's description (Matthew 3: 13-17) of this event. This is not a lengthy passage at all, so please, take a few minutes to read it.

This Gospel passage provides much to contemplate and pray about. When you read it, you might go in a different direction from what I offer in the following passages. However, in this reflection, I want to explore two virtues that jump out at me immediately. The first is humility; not only the humility of John the Baptist, but Jesus' humility also.

St. John the Baptist knew his place. Even though people were clamoring that he might be the Messiah, he pointed toward Jesus. He is humble because he recognizes who he is in light of Jesus and before Jesus. The Baptist's words from Matthew and these from John, reflect his humility: ***"I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals" (John 1: 27).*** But what is humility?

Humility is to recognize the truth about oneself, especially before God. John knew he was not the Messiah; not God; not the Creator. Rather he recognized who Jesus is and that Jesus had a much greater Baptism to give...the Holy Spirit.

Let's now consider the humility of Jesus, which we would describe as supernatural and a mystery; a revealed truth we cannot fully understand. What is it like for the one and only true God to become man? Could there ever be a more humble act than this? Moreover, Jesus is free of sin and therefore did not need John's baptism but chose to receive it anyway.

Jesus came to free us from our sins by carrying sin on Himself. God has joined us to show His solidarity with us and to lift us into His very own divine life by the power of the Holy Spirit so that if we freely choose, we become sons and daughters of God in His beloved Son Jesus.

The other virtue is obedience. John obeyed Jesus. He baptized Jesus even though he protested that Jesus should baptize John. Jesus also shows His obedience; His obedience to the will of His Heavenly Father.

Let's consider:

This was at the very beginning of Jesus's public ministry, and so to this point He has not

manifested who He is or that He was ushering in the Kingdom of God. And yet, what was it that he had done for the Father to say, ***"You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased?"***

Was Jesus pleasing the Father in the thirty silent years of his life? In His obedience to Mary and Joseph? Through His prayer life? In His work life? His growing in wisdom and knowledge? Probably, but Jesus's public identification with sinners; His Baptism in the Jordan foreshadowing the baptism into His suffering and death for sinful humanity pleased the Father so much that He wanted us all to know it. So we might want to prayerfully reflect: What does the virtue of humility mean to me? Have I thought about who I am before God? That God created me, loved me into existence and holds me in existence? That God created me with a plan; a purpose; a mission to carry out in my everyday life? Does gratitude flow from this?

Prayerfully reflect on the beautiful hymn of Jesus's humility in Philippians 2: 6-11.

What does it mean for me to obey God so that I may by God's grace become a son or daughter of God, pleasing to the Father? Do I obey God through my worship and prayer; obeying the Commandments; frequenting the Sacraments; studying the Bible and using it for prayer? Do I love God and neighbor as Jesus commanded?

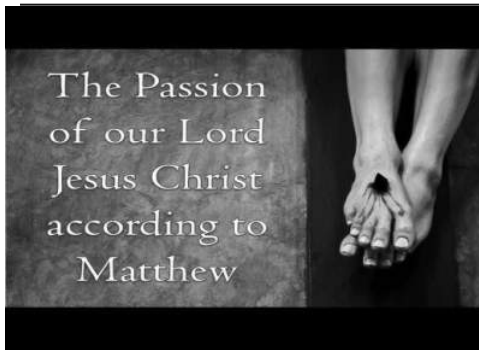
Humility and obedience...difficult virtues to grow in. And Jesus knows this. Our Gospel today reminds us that Jesus identifies with us in our failings and sins. So don't get discouraged because by His baptism, Jesus shows us that He is right here with us.

Let us pray..."I thank You Lord for the gift of Baptism and the graces you have given me. But I ask Your forgiveness for the times I have not responded to these graces or not honored the vows of my Baptism. I ask that You help me to respond to my Baptismal graces and vows. With Your help, may I become a pleasing son or daughter of our Heavenly Father."

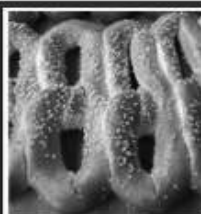

ST. TITUS OUTREACH PROGRAM

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John's Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. ***On an average day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.***

The casseroles are the "Main Course" of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God's poor and homeless who come to St. John's for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John's provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard "half tray". Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John's picks up the dishes from our freezer.



Here are some useful hints:

- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic "spork" (a combination spoon and fork).
- Please mark the lid with the main ingredients and date you prepared your casserole.

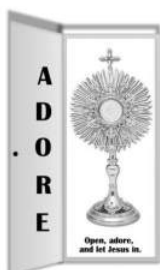

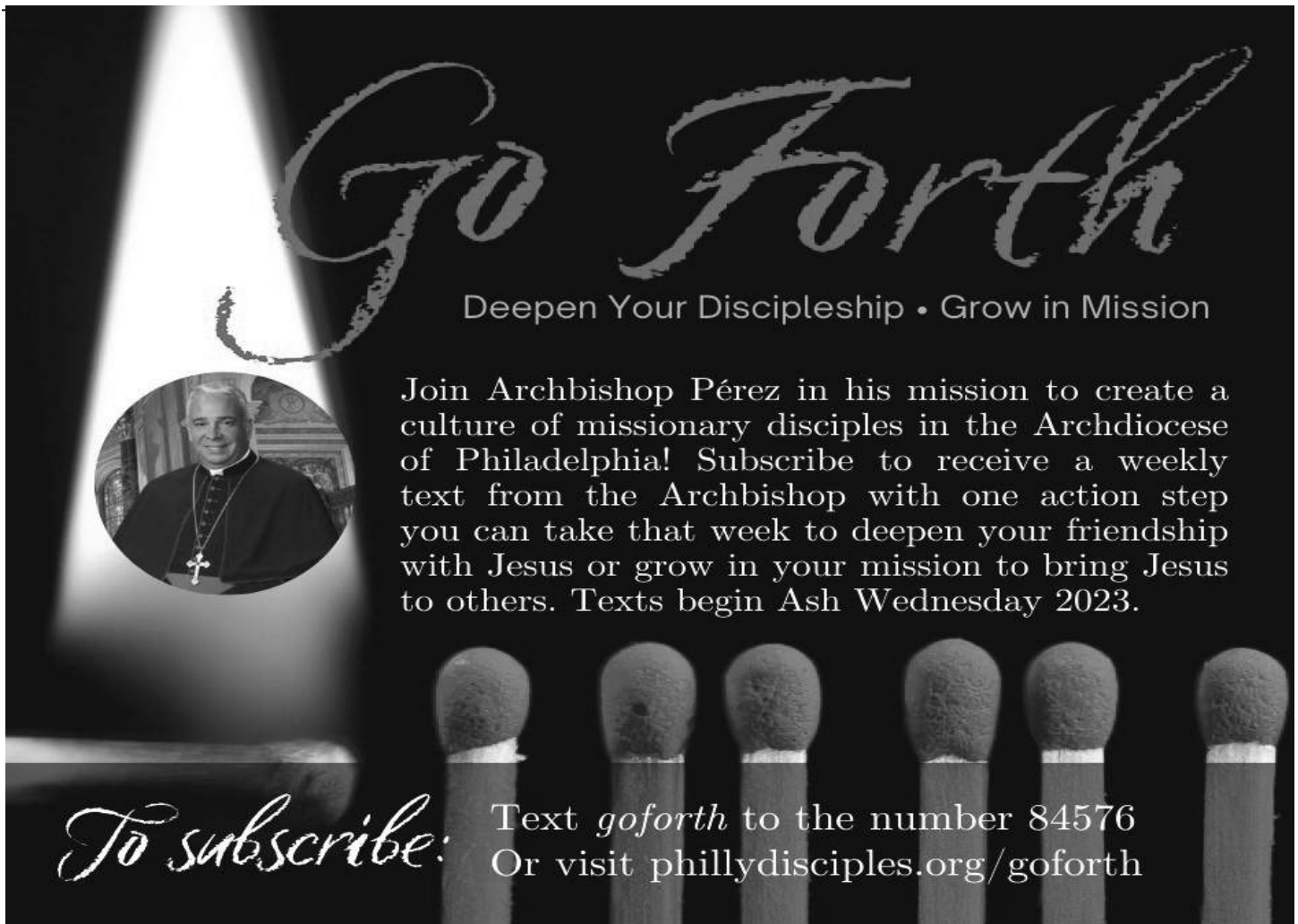
