SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Schedule with Parish Office for any Sunday at 11:15am. Baptisms are not performed on holidays. Pre-Jordan classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm in the St. Helena Convent. Call the Parish Office to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia requires that all couples attend Pre Cana class before marriage. At this time, we ask you to go to Archphil.org under Marriage preparations to take the class online.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. **To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office during regular hours at 610-279-4990.**

NIC NOTES

Dear Parishioners,
You may recall, the January 22 "Nic Notes", focused on my resignation as Pastor of St. Helena and as Parochial Administrator of St. Titus. To be clear, I requested retirement. In doing this, I will no longer be given an assignment by the Archbishop. Therefore, with the appointment of a new pastor, I will become Pastor Emeritus of St. Helena Parish.

You may question, what will I do in Retirement? I will be moving to a new Parish and will be assisting there as long as God gives me the strength. You may ask, why not stay at St. Helena? It wouldn't be in the role of Pastor; nor would there be the responsibility for the "souls" of the parishioners, which, by the way, includes a ton of administration and paperwork! No longer will I have to worry about the finances and bill paying. And whenever anything doesn't fit the fancy of someone, and they wish to file a "complaint", I'll be free to say, "It will be so much better if you take this matter up with the Pastor." These other "issues" have been a piece of my pastoral duties at Saint Helena. The temporal and spiritual responsibilities that come along with being pastor will no longer be my task.

As of right now, I do know where I'll be living. Here's a great little story. Over the last 12 years, I have also been the Dean of Western Montgomery County with the responsibility of being on the Council of Priests, as well as, being a member of the Personnel Board of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. As part of my responsibility as Dean, I would be involved in the Installation of new Pastors. Several years ago, I was at an Installation of a new Pastor and "did my thing". Since it was during the summer, the day was blistering hot. Immediately following the Installation Mass, I came back to St. Helena to freshen up with a change of clothing, fully intending to return to the celebration. The new Pastor realized he didn't see me and called to see where I was. I told him I would be returning, shortly. When I returned, in the midst of a conversation with him, he stops and looks at me and says, "Oh, now we are equals." I looked at him and said, "You will never be my equal!" How quickly tables turn! Now, he is going to be, not my equal, but my Pastor and "boss." God certainly has a sense of humor.

May I ask that you keep me in your prayers as I transition into my new role. May God, through the intercession of Our Blessed Mother, and Mother of us all, bless and guide us all the days of our lives!

Deacon Claude's Corner— The Holy Family and Our Families

The Church dedicates February to the Holy Family, Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Jesus, the Second Person of the one and only Divine family, the Holy Trinity, was born into a human family, consecrating that family as a community of love.

By Jesus coming into a human family, the Holy Trinity places its imprint for family life in the family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The Holy Family becomes the model for each family. Further, Jesus has come to draw the world into a family around him.

In his apostolic exhortation on the family, Saint John Paul II wrote, *"The family is the first and fundamental school of social living: as a community of love."*

You might have some doubts. Realistically, if your family is anything like mine, then we might say that, at times, we don't seem like a community of love.

Back in 1971, I learned in an introductory sociology class at Penn State that the family is the basic cell of society. Today, the breakdown of the family contributes more and more to the depressing state of affairs in the world, especially these United States.

Sadly, today we see so many hurting families. In some families, dysfunction; disinterested parents; a total lack of love. Families wracked by anger, fear, worry, anxiety, violence, addictions, or poverty. Self-interest, selfishness, and pride replace self-sacrificing love.

As Christians, we hope, and because we hope, each of our families can grow in holiness and in God's love. So let's prayerfully reflect together how each of our families might grow to become the community of love to which God calls us.

Right from the very beginning, God desired to prepare us to live in a communion of love by Baptizing us into the Divine Life of God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. And then in Confirmation, the Holy Spirit's gifts provide the tools we need to grow in God's love. Through these, the Eucharist, and all the Sacraments, the Word of God, and the Commandments, each individual family member and therefore each family has the potential to grow in holiness and become that community of love God intends.

Why is it that we don't take advantage of all of these that empower us to love?

Our world lies in darkness, destroying faith in so many people. Faith, Baptism, seeking God; wanting a relationship with Jesus; belief in the Holy Eucharist are increasingly buried under a mountain of selfishness; materialism; worries; depression; violence; anger;

indifference; addiction; and sensuality. I am not saying this to be judgmental, because I also must look in the mirror.

How might each of our families awaken our sleepy faith so that we can become families united in God's love? We can begin with prayer.

Let's try to pray as a family because prayer plugs us into God from where we came and to Whom we are meant to go. For one family member, this might entail one approach of prayer; for another, sacrifice. Maybe another could not care less, and then that will require the prayers and sacrifice of the faith-filled family members.

In one way or another, each of us sin. But Jesus is there to extend His mercy; that is why He came. He came for salvation, sacrifice, and self-sacrificing love. If we need repentance, we need to ask the Lord's forgiveness. As Jesus forgives us, we must forgive family members who have hurt us. Are we able to say, "I am sorry" or does pride or anger prevent us? If so, we must push aside our pride and ask for forgiveness. If we don't pray for humility to overcome pride, and in turn act humbly toward one another, we will not have peace in our families.

All of us parents, let us respond to Jesus; don't be afraid to read his words in the Bible; to speak of him; pray to Him; ask Him for the miracles You want for yourselves and your families. Love your families; place them first as Jesus has placed the human family first in self-sacrificing love.

As Jesus came because He wanted what is best for us, love Your family and prayerfully desire with all your hearts what is best for them, and that is to be all together in Heaven, in the family of the Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Holy Family, pray for our families!

ST. TITUS OUTREACH PROGRAM

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John's Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. **On an average day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.**

The casseroles are the "Main Course" of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God's poor and homeless who come to St. John's for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John's provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard "half tray". Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John's picks up the dishes from our freezer.

Here are some useful hints:

- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic "spork" (a combination spoon and fork).
- Please mark the lid with the main ingredients and date you prepared your casserole.





Kindergarten: Age 5 by September 1, 2023

First Grade: Age 6 by September 1, 2023

To complete the application process, the parent/guardian will need to provide copies of the following:

- Birth Certificate
- Certificate of Baptism
- If your child has received additional sacraments, we must have their complete dates
- Immunization Record
- PK-8 Registration Fee – \$125 per student (nonrefundable)
- Letter of subsidy payment from your pastor, K-8, if applicable
- Custody Papers, if applicable


