SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Schedule with Parish Office for any Sunday at 11:15am. Baptisms are not performed on holidays. Pre-Jordan classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm in the St. Helena Convent. Call the Parish Office to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia requires that all couples attend Pre Cana class before marriage. At this time, we ask you to go to Archphil.org under Marriage preparations to take the class online.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. **To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office during regular hours at 610-279-4990.**

NIC NOTES



Dear Parishioners,
 So often, we hear people saying that going to Church and/or participating at Holy Mass isn't that important because they can pray at home. Praying at home is a wonderful thing, but it does not take the place of going to Mass. Private prayer is great; when you pray at home, your prayer is personal and one dimensional. When you come to Mass, you pray with your whole being. You use all your senses. You see, hear, smell, taste and touch. You use your body by genuflecting, sitting, kneeling, standing, walking and singing.

When you go to Mass, these opportunities are given to you:

1. You seek forgiveness for your sins
2. You learn how God's Word impacts your life in the homily.
3. You offer yourself to the Lord.
4. You experience the miracle of bread and wine changing into the Body and Blood of Christ.
5. You reach out to others with the Peace of Christ.
6. You admit that you are not worthy, and then come forward to receive the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ.
7. You receive a special blessing.
8. You are commissioned to go out and to make the world a better place.

The above are to assist you in realizing why the Mass is so very, very important to participate in on a regular basis. It is also very important to realize that the Mass is more than entertainment. When entertainment is the model for church worship, the leaders try to induce particular feelings in the audience.

The Mass, however, is just the opposite. It is a ritual in which people bring their own feelings and incorporate them in the Liturgy. That's why it is possible for two people to attend the same Mass, one grieving a death and the other celebrating a birth. You both feel connected. The whole point is to go beyond feelings into authentic prayer which is offering of oneself to God in Jesus Christ.

Deacon Claude's Corner—Jesus' Difficult Teachings from the Sermon on the Mount

This Sunday, the sixth in Ordinary Time, we continue to hear from Jesus' famous Sermon on the Mount, which is found in chapters five through seven of Matthew's Gospel. However, because Lent begins in ten days, we will not hear the Sermon in its entirety. We will only hear through Matthew 5: 48.

Jesus makes clear that He has come as the founder, interpreter and authority over God's Law. And through the Sermon, He elevates the standards so that with the help of the grace He has won for us, we may grow in holiness, and become "greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven" (Matthew 5: 19). Through His teachings and commandments, Jesus is calling us beyond an earthly way of life, to a heavenly way of life!

However, to our 21st Century sensibilities, many may have some differences with what Jesus has to say about breaking His commandments; anger; letting go of grudges; seeking peace with those we are not too fond of; lust; adultery; divorce; swearing; and the existence of Hell. Later in Chapters six and seven, Jesus gives His commandments with respect to revenge and retaliation; the proper, humble attitude toward charitable giving; vanity; money as an idol; and, judging others.

In short, Jesus is telling us that we need to follow His teachings about these, or we "will not enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 5: 20) In fact, toward the end of Chapter seven, as He is wrapping up His Sermon, He says, "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road broad that leads to destruction, and those who enter through it are many. How narrow the gate and constricted the road that leads to life. And those who find it are few" (Matthew 7: 13-14).

So, what am I getting at? Is this fire and brimstone? Not at all! In fact, through His preaching, teaching, and His example, Jesus is expressing God's mercy. However, what I am getting at is this: Today, in our world, in our culture, we tend to shrug off Jesus' tough teachings because we are being subliminally conditioned to a "live and let live, anything goes" philosophy. Understandably, many perceive that God's commandments, Jesus' teachings, and Church teachings are too tough, or not relevant for this day and age. Since we rationalize that Jesus did

not mean them in the absolute sense, His teachings have become relativized.

Confusion reigns when it comes to Jesus' teachings, and it does not help that our Pope and bishops are not clear and united on teachings that address the moral and theological issues of the day. Such being the case, it is up to us to prayerfully develop our conscience so that we try to follow Christ's teachings. And to be mindful of the fact that we can only do so with the help of His grace. For as Jesus said in answer to the question, "Then who can be saved?" And he said, "What is impossible for human beings is possible for God" (Luke 18: 27).


I think it's important that we look at Jesus' teachings and the Commandments not as a series of "thou shall nots" that kill our joys, but instead as coming from a loving, merciful God who wants what is best for us to live fully human lives as He intended from the very beginning. Through His commandments and teachings, our merciful God wants us to grow in love with Him and with each other.


When we explore the "whys" behind Christ's teachings and the Church's teaching, we can come to understand better how much God loves us, extends His mercy to us, and wants us to flourish; to "be perfect as our Heavenly Father is perfect."

To help us better understand these "whys," I recommend the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the writings of the Church Fathers (<https://www.catholic.com/qa/who-were-the-church-fathers>) and an excellent resource for Catholic apologetics, Catholic Answers (catholic.com).

Let us pray for one another as we try to discern and live the teachings of Jesus!

ST. TITUS OUTREACH PROGRAM

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John’s Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. **On an average day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.** The casseroles are the “Main Course” of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God’s poor and homeless who come to St. John’s for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John’s provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard “half tray”. Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John’s picks up the dishes from our freezer.




Here are some useful hints:

- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic “spork” (a combination spoon and fork).
- Please mark the lid with the main ingredients and date you prepared your casserole.

- If your child has received additional sacraments, we must have their complete dates
- Immunization Record
- PK-8 Registration Fee – \$125 per student (nonrefundable)
- Letter of subsidy payment from your pastor, K-8, if applicable
- Custody Papers, if applicable




