SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Schedule with Parish Office for any Sunday at 11:15am. Baptisms are not performed on holidays. Pre-Jordan classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm in the St. Helena Convent. Call the Parish Office to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia requires that all couples attend Pre Cana class before marriage. At this time, we ask you to go to Archphil.org under Marriage preparations to take the class online.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. **To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office during regular hours at 610-279-4990.**

NIC NOTES

Dear Parishioners,

The Mass is our supreme act of worship! Whether we are 8 years old or 80 years old, at some point in our life, we probably have asked ourselves the question, "Why do we have to go to Mass?" We may not like the music or the homilies; we may just not feel like going; we may think that the Mass is boring; or we may feel that the parish community is not welcoming. We may even try to convince ourselves that we can pray just as well at home or outdoors!

Even though we know that going to Mass is a good thing. We can justify our decision by convincing ourselves that we are too busy, too tired, too bored, or even too frustrated. When that happens, we missed the great gift that God gives us in the Eucharist. We need to change our attitude about going to Mass. Why not think of Mass as the time in the day when you connect with God and with other people in a very, very special way. Why not make the Mass a priority!

Here are 10 good reasons why we should go to Mass:

- 1) God asks us to make one day holy. Going to Mass can help us to see everything from a different perspective. We can let go of our own agenda and allow God to inspire, guide, and strengthen us for the week ahead.
- 2) Jesus gives us the greatest of all gifts, the gift of Himself. Jesus offers Himself to us in the Word of God that we hear. In His Real Presence, He offers to us the Blessed Sacrament at Communion.
- 3) We need to be part of a community that gives us support, affirmation, and encouragement in our attempt to live the Gospel message. They help us to see that we are not alone. They remind us that we are part of the Body of Christ.
- 4) God has a special message for us. When we listen to the readings, the homily, and the prayers of the Mass, God speaks to us in a special way. We need to be open to what God is trying to tell us.
- 5) We need to talk to God. We speak to God during the Mass through our singing, our communal responses and prayers, and our personal prayers that come from the depths of our heart.

In my Nic Notes for next week, I will continue with the next five good reasons why we should go to Mass.


**LENT ALERT: Stations of the Cross**

LENTEN PRACTICES**FASTING & ABSTINENCE**

Ash Wednesday and Good

Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are **obligatory days of abstinence**. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, fasting is obligatory from age 18 through age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Abstinence from meat on Lenten Fridays applies to all aged 14 and above.



Deacon Claude's Corner—Lent: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22. If we have not thought about it already, our minds may gravitate toward, "What am I going to give up for Lent?" Many of us have ingrained the idea that we should "do something for Lent." I confess that for many years this has been my approach to Lent. However, Lent is meant for more isn't it?

Christ has come into this world out of love and mercy especially, but also to win our love; to conquer our hearts. Therefore, Lent is a time for us to not just focus on our obligatory sense to "give up," but especially to reflect on what Christ has given up for us, His very own life, out of love, and how we can return our love in response. The following beautiful hymn of the Early Church reminds us:

"Have among yourselves the same attitude that is also yours in Christ Jesus, Who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross (Philippians 2: 5-8).

The Gospel reading (Matthew 6: 1-6 and 16-18) for Ash Wednesday clearly shows the virtue of humility needed for our approach to our traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Humility is important to God.

The first reading from Joel the prophet (2: 12-18) reads, "Even now, says the LORD, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning; Rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the LORD, your God."

Here's our challenge then: Do the Big Three of Lent, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, help us to give our hearts to the Lord, and grow more in love with Him each day? Are these truly three expressions of love that lead us to return to the Lord and His mercy?

Our approach to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving begins with an attitude of humility. If we begin with the prayer that our Lenten objectives are to seek the Lord's mercy (repent) and convert ("rend our hearts" by giving them to the Lord in love and seeking His love), then the Holy Spirit will make sure that we have a successful Lent. With the help of God's grace, we can undertake prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as a means of realizing our objectives:

Prayer is speaking to God and listening; discerning what the Lord wills is best for us. Am I willing to commit more time to grow closer to God? To offer Him my heart? Is God, who created me and has placed me here and now with a mission and purpose for my life, worth my time? Worth my expressions and words of love? There are so many ways; here are a few. You may have better ways that suit your personality and responsibilities in life.

Praying with the words of Scripture, discerning the words that speak to your heart. The Divine Office or Prayer of the Church. The Rosary and/or Chaplet of Divine Mercy. Prayer litanies such as: The Sacred Heart; the Precious Blood; The Name of Jesus. Reading Christ's Passion from the Gospel and contemplating it, even praying with it. Spending time with the Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament. Looking to the saints for guidance in prayer.

Fasting is giving up something or some things so that we replace what we have given up with thoughts of God or with God Himself. In other words, growing more intimate with God. Fasting helps us realize our distance from God, recognize our sins, and lead us to sorrow and repentance.

What idols in my life, keep me from deepening my relationship with the Lord? What food and/or drink can I give up and instead be fed and quenched on God's Word and His Sacraments? What is it that I can spend less time doing and replace it to spend time with the Lord?


Almsgiving is charitable giving. Rather than be removed from an activity that provides a personal touch, like giving money, is there a way we can spend personal time, that is give the gift of ourselves, to others? Offering our personal touch to Martha's Choice or St. Vincent DePaul Society or Manna on Main or Project Home. How about visiting the sick or homebound? If we can't do these, how about the gift of prayer for the suffering, depressed, sorrowing?

As we anticipate Lent, may we pray for a humble approach to prayer, fasting and almsgiving that will deepen our relationship with the Lord and with one another!

ST. TITUS OUTREACH PROGRAM

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John's Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. ***On an average day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.*** The casseroles are the "Main Course" of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God's poor and homeless who come to St. John's for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John's provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard "half tray". Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John's picks up the dishes from our freezer.

Here are some useful hints:

- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic "spork" (a combination spoon and fork).
- Please mark the lid with the main ingredients and date you prepared your casserole.


