SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Schedule with Parish Office for any Sunday at 11:15am. Baptisms are not performed on holidays. Pre-Jordan classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm in the St. Helena Convent. Call the Parish Office to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia requires that all couples attend Pre Cana class before marriage. At this time, we ask you to go to Archphil.org under Marriage preparations to take the class online.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. **To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office during regular hours at 610-279-4990.**

These two Penance Services will take place on Tuesday, March 22 at St. Helena Church. Please avail yourself of the opportunity for this wonderful preparation for Easter.

The recitation of Divine Mercy Devotions is every day at 3pm in the Chapel at St Helena. There are also many opportunities to use FORMED. Just a reminder that the Archbishop has given permission to Catholics in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia to eat meat on St. Patrick's Day, March 17.


**LENT ALERT: Stations of the Cross**

Stations will be held every Friday evening at 7:00pm followed by Benediction at St. Titus. At St. Helena, Stations are on Thursdays at 11:30am and 7pm.

LENTE PRACTICES**FASTING & ABSTINENCE**

Ash Wednesday and Good

Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, fasting is obligatory from age 18 through age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Abstinence from meat on Lenten Fridays applies to all aged 14 and above.



Deacon Claude's Corner—The Seven Last Words of Christ

Word 3: "Woman, Behold Your Son"

Read John 19: 25-27.

In this passage, we see Jesus on the Cross, “giving His last will and testament. He had already committed His blood to the Church, His garments to His enemies, a thief to Paradise, and would soon commend His body to the grave and His soul to His Heavenly Father. To whom, then, could He give the two treasures which He loved above all others, Mary, His Mother, and John? He would bequeath them to one another, giving at once a son to His Mother and a Mother to His friend” (Sheen, Fulton, J. The Seven Last Words).

Mary gave birth to her first-born son in a cave in Bethlehem. On Good Friday, she brings forth her second born son, John. Mary undergoes the pains of child-birth through the pain she feels for her dying Son. In Jesus' life and death, Mary becomes the Mother of the Church and the mother of millions of redeemed disciples who, throughout the ages follow John the beloved disciple (John 13: 23).

At the foot of the Tree of the Cross, Mary, through her sacrifice and obedience, becomes the Mother of all those living in Christ. Through the life and death of Jesus, Mary, the Mother of God, becomes our Mother; Jesus, the Son of God, and the Son of Mary, becomes our brother.

“This act of giving and receiving was not meant only for our Blessed Mother and for John. It was meant as a command for us all. We are all invited to be present before the foot of the Cross in the person of this beloved disciple. Jesus looks at all of us from the Cross and says, ‘Behold, your mother.’ And He directs His own dear mother to turn to each one of us with love and affection, seeing her own precious child in each one of us.”

“It is possible the Apostles held their first Council in about 49 A.D. in Jerusalem precisely because Mary still dwelled in the holy city. She was likely the young religion’s greatest living witness and pillar of unity. We can imagine her presiding over early Christian gatherings with reserved solemnity, nursing primitive Christianity just as she had Christ.” (Preceding two paragraphs from My Catholic Life, Daily Reflections

For Meditation and Prayer

- Imagine yourself at the foot of the Cross, with Mary’s heart. In your life, when have you felt such sorrow or pain? Where was God? Were you able to look back and see His presence? If so, thank Him now. If not, then ask Him to reveal Himself in your difficult circumstances and trust Him to do so at the right time.
 - At the Cross, Mary must let go of her Son. Of whom, have we had to let go and felt tremendous pain, sorrow and loss? Recall that person now and your time together. Thank God for their life and their presence in your life. Entrust them now to the mercy of the “Forgiving Father,” the mercy that Jesus shows from the Cross.
 - Dying on the Cross, Jesus did not turn His pity inward; rather, His thoughts turn to others, Dismas, the Good Thief, to His mother Mary and to His disciple, John. In my life right now, am I feeling some sort of internal struggle or pain? During this Lenten season of sacrifice, shall I ask Jesus to instead help me turn outward to others who are suffering, mourning or hurting?
 - Mary says “yes” to God and all that means, including the sorrow that “pierced her heart like a sword” (Luke 2: 34-35), and her yes leads her to the foot of the Cross. She is an example of trust, obedience and humility. Let’s ask God to help us imitate these virtues.
 - At the Cross, the Mother of Jesus becomes the Mother of the Church and our Mother. Let’s ask our Mother to pray for the Church, for us, and for us to hear and do whatever Jesus tells us (John 2: 5).
 - Let’s pray together, “Hail Mary....”

ST. TITUS OUTREACH PROGRAM

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John's Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. ***On an average day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.*** The casseroles are the "Main Course" of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God's poor and homeless who come to St. John's for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John's provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard "half tray". Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John's picks up the dishes from our freezer.

Here are some useful hints:

- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic "spork" (a combination spoon and fork).
- Please mark the lid with the main ingredients and date you prepared your casserole.


