

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Schedule with Parish Office for any Sunday at 11:15am. Baptisms are not performed on holidays. Pre-Jordan classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm in the St. Helena Convent. Call the Parish Office to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia requires that all couples attend Pre Cana class before marriage. At this time, we ask you to go to Archphil.org under Marriage preparations to take the class online.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. **To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office during regular hours at 610-279-4990.**

Deacon Claude's Corner—Permanent Deacons—Week 2

Continuing our series on the permanent diaconate, we address the process for acceptance, formation, education, and training in the permanent diaconate program for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, which proceeds along these lines:

A potential candidate may sense a calling to the permanent diaconate, or someone such as his wife, a pastor, a permanent deacon, or fellow Catholic perceives a calling and suggests it to the potential deacon. The possible candidate then seeks to understand more about the permanent diaconate by researching and reading and attending the information evenings held throughout the Archdiocese.

Should he sense a calling and would like to test it before the Church, with the approval of his pastor, he then submits an application. If the application is accepted, the potential candidate will undergo interviews and psychological testing, and background checks. He will provide essays and letters of recommendation. This is known as the inquirer stage.

If the Church in Philadelphia determines that a man might have a diaconal vocation, the Church admits him to a formal discernment period (the aspirancy stage), which is a year of prayer, study, and personal formation. Aspirancy could then lead to formal candidacy.

Proceeding from aspirancy, the deacon candidate then undergoes five years of human, spiritual, intellectual, and pastoral formation at St. Charles Seminary. A wife's consent and support are required before her husband's ordination to the permanent diaconate.

In the final year of formation, the Archbishop accepts or rejects the candidate for ordination.

Threefold Ministry of Word, Liturgy and Charity

The deacon is ordained to a threefold ministry of service, including Word, Liturgy and Charity. The Ministry of the Word includes evangelization, catechesis (teaching), liturgical preaching and the proclamation of the Gospel. During the ordination rite, the ordaining Bishop hands the Book of the Gospels (you could see me or Deacon Ken process with this book at Mass) to the new deacon with the words: ***“Receive the Gospel of Christ, whose herald you now are: believe what you read, teach what you believe, and practice what you teach.”*** Basically then, “the deacon is called to proclaim the Scriptures and instruct and exhort the people.”

Depending on the deacon and the parish where he serves, he may conduct this service in different ways. For example, a ministry focusing on evangelization; proclaiming the Gospel and preaching at Mass;

leading Bible study, reflection, and prayer; and RCIA.

Deacons are also involved in the sacramental life (liturgy) of the Church. Deacons serve as ordinary ministers of Baptism. “Ordinary” means that this is a normal result of their ordination and the faculties they have received from the bishop; they also are ordinary ministers of Holy Communion.

Deacons officiate at weddings as the official witness of the Church; they preside at various prayer services in liturgies, including Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, public recitations of the Rosary, Stations of the Cross, the Liturgy of the Hours, and celebrations in absence of a priest.

While they do not celebrate the Anointing of the Sick, they are ordinary ministers of Viaticum (Holy Communion given to those in danger of death). They also may preside at wakes and funerals.

Deacons may give blessings, blessing most religious articles. They also bless people, especially in connection with various sacramental rites or liturgical services. To some degree or another, all of these have been part of my ministry and Deacon Ken's since our ordination.

Deacon Tidbits***Are Deacons an Answer to the Growing Shortage of Priests?***

No. While deacons can alleviate some of the effects of the shortage of priests by assuming administrative or sacramental duties that might enable priests to focus more exclusively on their sacred ministry, the answer to the shortage of priests is to pray for and foster more priestly vocations. The reason for ordaining deacons should not be because the Church needs more priests but, rather, because it needs more deacons.

Does Acceptance into Aspirancy Mean Automatic Ordination?

Acceptance into Aspirancy does not suggest or guarantee that a man will be ordained a deacon. Rather, entrance into Aspirancy seeks to guide and support a man's discernment of the question of whether God is calling him to serve as a deacon.

ST. TITUS OUTREACH PROGRAM

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John's Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. ***On an average day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.***



The casseroles are the "Main Course" of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God's poor and homeless who come to St. John's for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John's provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard "half tray". Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John's picks up the dishes from our freezer.

Here are some useful hints:

- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic "spork" (a combination spoon and fork).


