

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Schedule with Parish Office for any Sunday at 11:15am. Baptisms are not performed on holidays. Pre-Jordan classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm in the St. Helena Convent. Call the Parish Office to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia requires that all couples attend Pre Cana class before marriage. At this time, we ask you to go to Archphil.org under Marriage preparations to take the class online.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office during regular hours at 610-279-4990.

Deacon Claude's Corner-Permanent Deacons-Week 3

Threefold Ministry of Word, Liturgy, and Charity

Last week, we covered Word and Liturgy, two elements of the deacon's threefold ministry. This week, we will explain a little about the ministry of Charity.

As we mentioned before, the deacon is ordained to serve. He expresses this service most significantly in the ministry of Charity. In imitating Christ the servant, deacons should demonstrate and witness Jesus' same self-sacrifice in service to others. Jesus, washing the feet of His Apostles and commanding them to do the same (John 13: 1-17), is our model of servant-leadership. The deacon is to identify the needs of others; humbly lead others to meet those needs; and, assist in meeting these needs.

This service could entail many charitable works that the deacon may carry out in "the real world." The deacon's ministry of charity could include visiting the sick; the Pro-Life Movement; teaching others the Faith, in particular in the ministry of apologetics, especially as the Church undergoes attack today; visiting those in prison; helping a parish or others by forming organizations to help families in need because of job loss or tragedy; and, any other identified need that helps the Church to carry out its Mission.

Deacon Tidbits and Questions

What should we call a deacon? Most of us address a priest as "Father" out of respect for his being the "Father" of the spiritual community or parish. Likewise, a deacon is shown respect by calling him "Deacon." Personally, I leave this to the comfort level of the individual. So, "Deacon," "Deacon Claude" or just plain, "Claude" are all fine with me. I would recommend that children call me "Deacon" or "Deacon Claude."

How do deacons support themselves and their families? Deacons are responsible for providing for themselves and their families. Most do this by remaining in whatever job, career, or profession they had already chosen before ordination. Others take positions within the Church, such as a parish business manager, parish administrator, teacher, diaconate director, etc.

What obligations do permanent deacons have with respect to the vocation of marriage? For married deacons, Deacon Claude family comes first. If being ordained hurts a deacon's family life, rather than helping his family grow in love, unity and faith, then something is wrong.

If the wife of a deacon dies before her husband, he may not remarry. Deacons who are unmarried at the time of ordination take a vow of celibacy; they may not marry after ordination.

How are deacons required to dress? Here in this Archdiocese, when carrying out our diaconal ministry, we must wear a grey clerical shirt with a white collar. For liturgy, we wear the alb and a stole. At Mass, we wear a dalmatic (similar to the priest's chasuble) over the alb and stole.

What does the term "faculties" mean? All priests and deacons must have faculties from the diocesan bishop, in our case, Archbishop Perez. Faculties describe the specific authority the priest or deacon has to exercise certain functions. The deacon's functions normally include celebrating baptisms, weddings, funerals, and prayer services; proclaiming the Gospel and preaching at Mass; and performing other functions described in Canon and liturgical law. (101 Questions and Answers on Deacons by William T. Ditewig)

How are deacons assigned? At ordination, deacons promise obedience to the diocesan bishop and his successors. Deacons, like priests, receive their assignments from the bishop, who may appoint them to any pastoral ministry throughout the diocese.

Is every deacon assigned to a parish? Yes, for the most part; however, the parish to which a deacon is assigned may or may not be his home parish. If a deacon is not assigned to his home parish, consideration is given to keeping him relatively close to home.

Like priests, the number of permanent deacons is decreasing. Consequently, here in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, we are in the beginning stages of split assignments and secondary assignments. So for example, I have a split assignment, i.e., being assigned to both St. Titus and St. Helena. Other deacons may have a secondary assignment. For example, a deacon may have a permanent parish assignment, but is also assigned to serve one weekend a month at a parish with no deacons.

Prayer and reflection for this week: Read John 13: 1-17. How is Jesus calling you to serve in imitation of Him? Next week, we conclude with our personal callings to the diaconate.

ST. TITUS OUTREACH PROGRAM

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John's Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. *On an average*

day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.

The casseroles are the "Main Course" of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God's poor and homeless who come to St. John's for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John's provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard "half tray". Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John's picks up the dishes from our freezer. Here are some useful hints:

- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic "spork" (a combination spoon and fork).
- Please mark the lid with the main ingredients and date you prepared your casserole.
