



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Schedule with Parish Office for any Sunday at 11:15am. Pre-Baptismal classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm at St. Helena Parish. Call the St. Helena Parish Office (610-275-7711) to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the St. Titus Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. All couples are required to attend Pre-Marital class before marriage. Go to Archphila.org under Marriage preparations to register for the class online.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. **To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office at 610-279-4990.**

MEMORIALS:

Mass Cards and Candles in honor of the living or in memory of the deceased are available at the Parish Office.

LIVE STREAM OF SUNDAY MASS: You can view the 4:00pm Saturday Vigil Mass and the 7:30am, 9am and 11am Sunday Masses by **livestream from St. Helena Church.** Go to the St. Helena Parish website at <https://www.sainthelena-centersquare.net> and select the **livestream** button on the right hand side of the homepage.

PLEASE NOTE: New **EMERGENCY CLERGY CONTACT** number to be used if **Danger of Death** exists or calling after office hours. Call 610-275-7711 (St. Helena).

Election of Godparents: One Godparent is required. Two Godparents—one male, one female may be appointed. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, 16 years of age or older, fully initiated into the Church (Baptized and Confirmed) at least 6 months before baptism. A non-Catholic may stand as a Christian Witness. Former Catholics are ineligible. Godparents must obtain a *Certificate of Eligibility* from their parish; Christian Witnesses must provide a copy of their baptismal record. These documents and baptismal stipend must be received by the parish office one week before the day of Baptism.

SACRAMENT PREPARATION: All children attending a Catholic public or private school (Grades 2 or Grades 7 &8) are to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation at the parish where registered. If you are members of St. Titus Parish, please contact the Parish Office 610-279-4990 for Sacrament info and registration.

Deacon Claude's Christmas Message

No doubt, by Christmas Day, many gifts will have been given and exchanged. Even the smallest gift, when given voluntarily and from the heart, expresses something to the person on the receiving end. Gifts can show a person that we care for them. We delight in seeing the person light up on receiving the gift; on expressing their gratitude and pleasure; and even in sharing the gift with others. Gift-giving then should be a way of expressing love, or at least a way of saying that we care.

Because of all the trappings of this season, sometimes we forget, yours truly included, that Christmas is all about the giving of the ultimate gift, and all that it expresses. All wrapped into one, God has given us the "Wow!" gift; the thoughtful gift; the unusual gift; the surprise gift; the selfless gift; the perfect gift. God has given us the gift of Himself in the person of Jesus Christ, His Son, the Eternal Word, and the fulgence of God's glory. Jesus is the ultimate gift because He is the human and personal expression of God's love for us; He is as Isaiah writes, our Savior who comes to us; Emanuel, God with us.

God, all-perfect, eternal spirit, and love, becomes a human and enters a world thirsting for love. The all-powerful, omnipotent God takes on human frailty as a cold, shivering, dependent baby in a manger. The God who is praised and worshipped and adored by angels as well as shepherds is one of us. God who created a perfect world, joins us in our imperfect world so that He can laugh as we laugh, share as we share, but hurt as we hurt, cry as we cry, be tempted as we are tempted, suffer as we suffer, mourn as we mourn, and die as we die.

However, just as the gifts we have given or received can be treated with indifference, ingratitude, be ridiculed or even ignored, so can we do the same with the gift of Jesus.

In this season of peace, joy, love, reconciliation, and gift-giving, we should cut through all the sentiments, emotions, and symbols and get to their root and their basic meaning.

What does the gift of Jesus mean for my life? What has He meant? What should He mean?

If Jesus is God's gift of light that shines in the darkness of this world, does His light shine in our lives? How do we shine the light of Christ to others?

If Jesus is the gift of Emanuel, "God with us," do others see that God is indeed with us by the life we lead, the words we speak, and our actions?

If He is the gift that reconciles us to God and helps us make peace with God, then how do we share God's peace daily? How do we make peace with each other?

If He is the gift that shows us how to love as God desires and gives us the capacity to do so by a rebirth in the Holy Spirit, then how do we love Him in return? Is my whole heart, mind body, and soul truly lifted to God when I come to worship him? How do we share the love that has been given us?

If Jesus is the gift that brought God's pardon, mercy, and forgiveness, then how do we receive these, thank God for these, and then turn around and show pardon, mercy, and forgiveness to others?

And if He is the gift that died to give us eternal life, then how do we share and express the thanksgiving and joyful hope of living forever with God and our loved ones?

Yes, Jesus is God's perfect gift to us, the love of God expressed to us in many ways. He fills our emptiness. He completes our inadequacies. But, then what could we ever give God in return?

St. Bernard said, "What use is it to us if Christ is born in Bethlehem but not in our own hearts?"

Our gift back to God then is to say, "Yes" to Christ's presence in our hearts and minds and all our actions, not just at Christmas, but every day of our lives.






