

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Schedule with Parish Office for any Sunday at 11:15am. Pre-Baptismal classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm at St. Helena Parish. Call the St. Helena Parish Office (610-275-7711) to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the St. Titus Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. All couples are required to attend Pre-Marital class before marriage. Go to Archphila.org under Marriage preparations to register for the class online.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office at 610-279-4990.

Election of Godparents: One Godparent is required. Two Godparents one male, one female may be appointed. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, 16 years of age or older, fully initiated into the Church (Baptized and Confirmed) at least 6 months before baptism. A non-Catholic may stand as a Christian Witness. Former Catholics are ineligible. Godparents must obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish; Christian Witnesses must provide a copy of their baptismal record. These documents and baptismal stipend must be received by the parish office one week before the day of Baptism.

SACRAMENT PREPARATION: All children attending a Catholic public or private school (Grades 2 or Grades 7 &8) are to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation at the parish where registered. If you are members of St. Titus Parish, please contact the Parish Office 610-279-4990 for Sacrament info and registration.

Deacon Claude's Corner—The Feast of the Holy Family

On the Sunday after Christmas (December 31 this year), the Church holds up for us the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph as our model.

However, we live in a cynical, critical, world. So, many might respond, "That's not us. That's not my family. We are not Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, nor are we capable of being like them!"

While this may be so, God still calls all families to be holy and united, tied together strongly by the bond of love. And the Church reinforces this.

St. John Paul II wrote, "As the family goes, so goes the nation and so goes the whole world in which we live" (Homily November 30, 1986; Perth, Australia).

Most sociologists would agree. I learned something basic in an introductory level sociology class that I took at Penn State. The family is the basic cell or building block of society. In his Letter to Families (4), St. John Paul II wrote "...each family (is) a living cell of the great and universal family of mankind."

If we allow it, this feast challenges us to look within our families and ask ourselves:

- "Who are we as a family?
- Who are we called to be?
- For what plan or purpose has God placed us within our families?"

The Scripture readings for this Feast of the Holy Family offer some practical advice for strengthening families. Realistically speaking, it would be difficult to take all of this advice at once and put it into practice. Perhaps, what we can do instead, is identify one weakness and make a New Year's resolution as a family to try to correct it.

The reading from Sirach shows us that love, honor, respect, kindness, obedience, and friendship are most important to a family. To the extent that any of these might be lacking in our families, then let's resolve to prayerfully try to change it for the better.

Next, we can look at St. Paul's letter to the Colossians for this Feast of the Holy Family. The average family has some degree of turmoil in it since no family is perfect. But taking our cues from this letter, family turmoil can certainly be lessened when we practice compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, and forgiveness, and tie the bow of love around these.

Aren't these virtues especially needed to help keep the family together?

Lastly in the Gospel, we see Joseph and Mary following the values, traditions, and faith most important to the Jewish people. How important then are prayer, worship, values, and our Catholic faith and its traditions in our family? How can we better worship, praise and give thanks together as a Catholic family?

If we thought about it, isn't eternal life in heaven with God the greatest desire we could have for our families, and helping each family member to achieve this, our way of showing our families all the love in the world?

Each of our families is not *The Holy Family*, but we are called to be holy families. As Jesus was God present in the Holy Family, so he is with us if we allow him to be.

So my friends on this feast, let us hand over our families to the Holy Family and ask Jesus, Mary, and Joseph to watch over our families. Ask them to pray for us that God will give us the grace to make changes in our families where needed, and indeed become holy families, for our own good and the good of the world family.


Let us pray that the Spirit help us recognize the gift of different charisms within the Christian community, and to discover the richness of different ritual traditions in the heart of the Catholic Church.

St. TITUS OUTREACH PROGRAM

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John's Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. *On an average*

day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.

The casseroles are the "Main Course" of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God's poor and homeless who come to St. John's for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John's provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard "half tray". Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John's picks up the dishes from our freezer.

Here are some useful hints:

- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic "spork" (a combination spoon and fork).
- Please mark the lid with the main ingredients and date you prepared your casserole.


