SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Schedule with Parish Office for any Sunday at 11:15am. Pre-Baptismal classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm at St. Helena Parish. Call the St. Helena Parish Office (610-275-7711) to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the St. Titus Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. All couples are required to attend Pre-Marital class before marriage. Go to Archphila.org under Marriage preparations to register for the class online.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. **To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office at 610-279-4990.**

Mass Cards and Candles in honor of the living or in memory of the deceased are available at the Parish Office.

Election of Godparents: One Godparent is required. Two Godparents—one male, one female may be appointed. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, 16 years of age or older, fully initiated into the Church (Baptized and Confirmed) at least 6 months before baptism. A non-Catholic may stand as a Christian Witness. Former Catholics are ineligible. Godparents must obtain a *Certificate of Eligibility* from their parish; Christian Witnesses must provide a copy of their baptismal record. These documents and baptismal stipend must be received by the parish office one week before the day of Baptism.

SACRAMENT PREPARATION: All children attending a Catholic public or private school (Grades 2 or Grades 7 &8) are to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation at the parish where registered. If you are members of St. Titus Parish, please contact the Parish Office 610-279-4990 for Sacrament info and registration.

Deacon Claude's Corner—The Epiphany of Our Lord

Liturgically, this year, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany on January 7. The word Epiphany means “manifestation.” Most Christians know that this manifestation is God revealing Himself to us in the person of His Son Jesus. Jesus, humbly coming in the flesh, a babe in a manger. In a sense then, Epiphany is like a “little Christmas” or second Christmas.

Why? Because the Epiphany celebrates that Israel’s Messiah has come not only for the Jewish people but all people. You and I are not Jewish, and yet we share in “salvation which is from the Jews” (John 4: 19-22). Jesus, the Jewish Messiah has brought salvation to all people of the world. The Scripture readings for the Epiphany are chock full of reminders to this effect:

“Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance. Raise your eyes and look about; they all gather and come to you” (Isaiah 60: 3-4).

“Lord, every nation on earth will adore you” (Responsorial Psalm, cf 72: 11)

“The Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel” (Ephesians 3: 6).

“Behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, ‘Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage’” (Matthew 2: 1-2)

How did these Magi know to go west and do homage to the “newborn king of the Jews?” Was it the Star, for they read the signs of the heavens, and their familiarity with Jewish prophecies? Or, as some early theologians speculate, did angels tell them and guide them, as an angel revealed the newborn king to the shepherds (Luke 2: 8-14)?

It might be nice to speculate about the Star of Bethlehem and angels in the context of Christmas and Epiphany, but the fact is that Jesus, the Messiah, Lord and God has manifested Himself to you, me, and all people for our salvation. How shall we respond?

Maybe the Magi’s three gifts can offer suggestions to us:

Gold-Indicative of royalty, a gift for a king. May Jesus be king of our hearts, ruling, guiding, and loving us and in return, may we give homage, worship, and praise to the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, thankful for the gift of salvation. Let us sing with the angels, Gloria in Excelsis Deo! Glory to God in the highest!

Frankincense-As used in our Catholic liturgies and which comes to us from the rituals of God’s people in the Old Testament. Incense, like sweet smelling prayers offered up to the Lord (Revelation 8: 3-4). May our prayers rise to the Lord as pleasing offerings because we bring the love, honesty, openness, and obedience of our hearts. As Mary gave her “yes” to God, making Christmas possible, may we also give our “yes” to God. “Thy will be done Lord, on earth as it is in heaven.”

Myrrh-Used in perfumes, medicines and most significantly to slow decomposition of the body and to hide the odor of death. The shadow of Jesus’s death on the Cross hung over Him even at His Epiphany. May we join ourselves through our trials, tribulations, and sufferings to Jesus on His Cross, grateful that our crosses like His, will lead to our resurrection.

ST. TITUS OUTREACH PROGRAM

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John's Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. ***On an average day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.***

The casseroles are the "Main Course" of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God's poor and homeless who come to St. John's for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John's provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard "half tray". Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John's picks up the dishes from our freezer.

Here are some useful hints:

- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic "spork" (a combination spoon and fork).
- Please mark the lid with the main ingredients and date you prepared your casserole.




