

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Schedule with Parish Office for any Sunday at 11:15am. Pre-Baptismal classes are required for parents and optional for Godparents. Classes are usually offered the first Monday of the month at 7pm at St. Helena Parish. Call the St. Helena Parish Office (610-275-7711) to register for class. Letters of eligibility are due at the St. Titus Parish Office before a date for Baptism can be confirmed.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples must make arrangements at least six months in advance of the requested date. Contact the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with clergy. All couples are required to attend Pre-Marital class before marriage. Go to Archphila.org under Marriage preparations to register for the class online.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

Catholics who are seriously ill or weakened by old age are encouraged to request this Sacrament. Those entering the hospital for surgery are invited to receive this sacrament prior to admission. **To arrange home visits for anointing, confession or Holy Communion for parishioners, please call the Parish Office at 610-279-4990.**

MEMORIALS:

Mass Cards and Candles in honor of the living or in memory of the deceased are available at the Parish Office.

SACRAMENT PREPARATION: All children attending a Catholic public or private school (Grades 2 or Grades 7 & 8) are to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation at the parish where registered. If you are members of St. Titus Parish, please contact the Parish Office 610-279-4990 for Sacrament info and registration.

PLEASE NOTE: New **EMERGENCY CLERGY CONTACT** number to be used if **Danger of Death** exists or calling after office hours. Call 610-275-7711 (St. Helena).

Election of Godparents: One Godparent is required. Two Godparents—one male, one female may be appointed. Godparents must be practicing Catholics, 16 years of age or older, fully initiated into the Church (Baptized and Confirmed) at least 6 months before baptism. A non-Catholic may stand as a Christian Witness. Former Catholics are ineligible. Godparents must obtain a *Certificate of Eligibility* from their parish; Christian Witnesses must provide a copy of their baptismal record. These documents and baptismal stipend must be received by the parish office one week before the day of Baptism.





**LENTEN PRACTICES
FASTING & ABSTINENCE**

Ash Wednesday and Good

Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the

Latin Catholic Church, fasting is obligatory from age 18 through age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Abstinence from meat on Lenten Fridays applies to all aged 14 and above.



Deacon Claude's Corner—Jesus, the Face of God's Mercy

I read somewhere that human suffering “is the rock of atheism.” Someone else wrote, “No one can believe in a God as father after all the suffering of children.” This gives us something to consider... We believe in God, but how do we perceive God?

Last week we mentioned that, on this side of Heaven, God expresses His love as endless mercy. Therefore, God cannot be indifferent to the suffering on earth. The thing is... How would, or how does God express or communicate this mercy to us?

We read in the prologue to St. John's Gospel: “In the beginning was the Word; and the Word was with God and the Word was God and the Word became flesh and dwelt amongst us.”

God becomes one of us through His Son Jesus Christ. Entering humanity, God rolled up his sleeves and took on, our muck, mire, and mess. Jesus came to make God's mercy visible to us.

In his book, *Making Sense of Suffering*, Peter Kreeft, Catholic philosopher, writes, “Jesus is the tears of God;” and St. John Paul II wrote in *Dives in Misericordia*, “By his actions and words, Christ makes the Father present among men.”

Luke 4: 16-21 reveals He is the Anointed, the Messiah whom God sent to show his mercy; to be with His people in their trials and tribulations. In doing so, God takes all evil, sin, and suffering upon himself and converts it to good for all eternity.

Jesus came to encourage the poor and to help them endure their suffering; to help them find hope that one day their misfortunes will be reversed and that trusting in Him and God's mercy with faith, they will be rewarded in heaven.

Jesus calls the poor in spirit; the humble for they are open to God and the mercy he has for them. Jesus brings release and freedom to us captured in sin and by sin.

The “acceptable year” that St. Luke refers to is now a time of mercy, written in the Blood of Christ, which extends to the end of time.

In his life, Jesus worked miracles; and he spoke and taught forcefully, eloquently, and convincingly. He forgave sins. He healed the sick. He suffered, died, and rose from the dead. All as acts manifesting the self-sacrificing love of God. All, to express the mercy of God.

“Not only does Jesus speak of mercy and explain it by the use of comparisons and parables, but above all he himself exemplifies it and personifies it. He himself, in a certain sense, is mercy. God becomes visible in a particular way as the father who is rich in mercy.” (*Dives in Misericordia*; Pope John Paul II)

“Mercy is the central nucleus of the gospel message; it is the very name of God, the face with which he revealed himself in the old covenant and fully in Jesus Christ, the Incarnation of creative and redemptive love.” (Pope Benedict, *Regina Caeli* address, March 30, 2008)

Some of us struggle with seeing Jesus' immense suffering, the cruelty extended to him, and his death, especially when we ponder the Passion, and we see a movie like the *Passion of the Christ*. But this also reflects the mercy of God and his justice.

“The Cross is there because sin exists. But love also exists. The Cross is the fruit of God's love in response to men's sins. God chose to send his Son into the world to bring about the salvation of mankind through the sacrifice of his own life, and this tells us much about God himself. Specifically the Cross reveals to us the mercy and justice of God” (*Opus Dei*, Topic 10, *Passion and Death on the Cross*; 2).

I like the way Pope Francis (*Misericordiae Vultus*) summarized this. “...mercy is a key word that indicates God's action towards us. He does not limit himself merely to affirming his love but makes it visible and tangible. Love, after all, can never be just an abstraction. By its very nature, it indicates something concrete: intentions, attitudes, and behaviors that are shown in daily living. The mercy of God is his loving concern for each one of us. He feels responsible; that is, he desires our well-being, and he wants to see us happy, full of joy, and peaceful.”

May this Lent be for all of us, a time to repent and receive the overflowing mercy of the Divine Heart expressed in Jesus!

ST. TITUS OUTREACH PROGRAM

St. Titus Parish has been making casseroles for St. John's Hospice in Center City Philadelphia for over 25 years. ***On an average day, SJH serves 57 casseroles to hundreds of residents and day service guests. Casseroles are donated by 47 parishes in the area including our parish.***



The casseroles are the "Main Course" of a complete, hot meal that is served to hundreds of God's poor and homeless who come to St. John's for their daily bread. Please do not feel restricted to the recipes which can be found on the recipe sheets near the casserole pan in the vestibule. Your favorite recipe is most welcome! So are store bought casseroles such as Stouffers or Oncor. St. John's provides us with pans and lids for your dishes. If you provide your own, please use a standard "half tray". Each casserole serves 6-8 men. Each month, St. John's picks up the dishes from our freezer.

Here are some useful hints:

- Please bring your casseroles frozen to church and put them in the freezer located in the vestibule of the Social Hall. If the door to the Social Hall is locked, please leave the casserole with a sacristan or maintenance.
- Prepare your recipe so that it can be eaten with a plastic "spork" (a combination spoon and fork).
- Please mark the lid with the main ingredients and date you prepared your casserole.




