Feast of St. Thérèse of Lisieux: September 27, 2015

My Dear Parishioners,

I do hope that you have a Happy Feast Day.

What a wonderful week to be celebrating our patron, St. Theresa. I am quite sure that your hearts were warmed also when The Pontiff, (from the Latin word, *pontifex*, meaning *Bridge Builder*) Pope Francis, addressed Congress on Thursday. What an impressive sight, The Servant of the Servants of God addressing some of the most powerful people in the country.

We have no need to be fearful of the message of the Gospel and the rich treasury that is the Church's teaching on social justice. Pope Francis spoke as an immigrant and a son of immigrants. He reminded us not to see refugees as a mere number that stand in need, but rather to see each one as a son or daughter of God, and therefore our brother and sister. Cardinal Bernardin speaks of the catholic social teaching in terms of a 'seamless garment,' *i.e.*, all matters of life—conception, old age, natural death—are treated with dignity. We are unable to pick one moral issue to work for at the expense or neglect of another.

In Pope Francis we have a beautiful illustration of one who is great—in his faith, in his simplicity, and in his conviction that the message he brings is not in his name alone and is intended for all peoples. On the National Mall after his talk, he asked those who find prayer difficult or who have no faith, to send him his good wishes.

"A nation can be considered great when it defends liberty as Lincoln did, when it fosters a culture which enables people to 'dream' of full rights for all their brothers and sisters, as Martin Luther King sought to do; when it strives for justice and the cause of the oppressed, as Dorothy Day did by her tireless work, the fruit of a faith which becomes dialogue and sows peace in the contemplative style of Thomas Merton." —Pope Francis.

On this our feast day we rejoice. The same faith that belonged to a teenage girl in France in an enclosed Carmelite Convent motivates the successor of St. Peter to live out in work and action the prayer that Jesus made the night before He died, "May they all be one." Our celebration is best lived out in joy, gratitude, prayer and service to those most in need.



Marriage Group

Pope Francis is seeking ways of helping married couples who have been divorced. As pastor, I continue to be available for these caught in the pain of separation and divorce through counseling. At the moment, we do hold a group once a week for twelve on occasions throughout the year for those who have experienced the trauma of divorce.

This pain can carry added grief for people of faith. After ten years of facilitating groups for addicts and their families in London, and as a result of a course I recently completed in Family Therapy, I wish to offer a safe container in the form of a group for people who have questions about marriage, while they are still in relationship. It might be for couples who are recently married and have the usual teething troubles of "two becoming one." It could be empty-nesters, as their children leave for college or new adventure. My hope is that such a group, with all of the expected confidence needed for people to share their vulnerability, would be something of a preventative nature.
