# Hurricane Harvey Relief Efforts

hile we are very blessed that the School and Church campus sustained only minor damage, we know that many have suffered great losses. St. Theresa School diligently assessed the damage that our staff and school families have personally endured and created with the support of the school PTO a Hurricane Recovery Volunteer Group to help manage and organize ongoing coordinated efforts to match up those who can help, with those who need help. The school successfully created an online Safety Check-in and initiated a PTO/Homeroom Phone Tree. Nine school families and four staff members have been identified and assisted by our school parents using Sign-up Geniuses and Meal Trains supporting them during this time of hardship.

During the first days after the storm, the Church was able to redirect and connect many individuals, families and out of state organizations that contacted us during that time. Many donations to Casa Juan Diego have been received and delivered during these last two weeks. Our clergy has spent continuous hours at the George R. Brown center bringing peace and hope to the hearts of our fellow Catholic brothers and sisters in distress. Financial donations have been redirected to the Archdiocesan Hurricane Relief Fund and volunteers have been connected to either volunteer centers or directly to those who are in need. As we learn of more parishioners and families in need we ask you to keep them in your prayers and consider volunteering in our different ministries to help bring back normalcy to our beloved community.

Both the School and the Church put together many available materials with resourceful information accessible to our families. Even though there is plenty more to do, we would like to thank our many volunteers and staff members who have spent long hours helping those in need. In another situation, we handed a bulletin to someone wearing several wristband IDs, indicating they were staying in a shelter. Many others reported that they were fine and had been helping others.

We all share the responsibility to preserve and improve both the structure and community of our church and school. We very grateful that so many have contributed to the Capital Campaign to assure our church and school will be here for the future.

# After We Move Out of the Church, What Happens Next?

here will be a period of a few weeks and perhaps as long as a month or two between the move out and the actual start of construction in the Church. There are a number of preparations that have to be made before construction is started. These "get ready" steps include: covering and protecting some of the stained glass windows and permanent fixtures, removing and storing some of the other stained glass windows, removing and storing the Chi Rho with the Lamb of God from behind the altar, removing and protecting the marble from the altars, ambo and cantor podium, removing and/or refurbishing wood paneling and grill work, removing and storing the Stations of the Cross and the statues, moving the clergy vestments to the new sacristy in the pastoral center, relocating all of the liturgical supplies to the new Mass locations for storage and use. It is important to note that many of the features that are in the Church before construction will be utilized in the Church or other locations when we move back into the Church. In addition to the above pre-construction activities, the pews will be removed.


