




PARISH HOLIDAY OFFICE CLOSURE

Lent and the Flood

I would bet money that somewhere in your church this Lent, there's a bare tree branch draped in purple fabric and an empty bowl filled with rocks.

I'm not poking fun, the desert imagery that surrounds the season of Lent isn't a cliché — or if it is, it's only because clichés are essentially true. Lent is the desert. Lent is the wilderness. Lent is the time of less. But what if Lent was also the flood? It seems counterintuitive, floods are excessive, and we don't think of Lent as a time for superabundance. Lent is when we limit experiences outside of ourselves in order to limit proclivities within ourselves. Lent is not a time for anything to be washing over us, consuming us, carrying us away on a tide. Unless...it is. Consider the flood of the Old Testament. An act of destruction, ves. but also an act of purification. An endurance test for the soul, an epic trust fall exercise between God and Noah in which Noah had to ride the literal waves, clinging to life as God wiped away everything familiar. Everything sinful. In Lent, we relinquish our weaknesses and our infirmities to the flood. It's frightening, certainly. But it's also exciting. Because just as the flood destroys everything, it also makes everything possible. It is a baptism. Lent, like the flood, makes the world new.



And just like that it is Lent again! What did you give up for Lent? Did you also decide to do something for Lent like read the Bible more or do a few service projects? Do you think it'll last? For a lot of us Lent is like the Catholic version of a New Year's resolution. We give up fried food or say we will workout more and, just like most people who do New Year's resolutions, we either fail or we make it to the end of Lent and then we go back to eating that same food or not working out. What was the point? Honestly, for many people it was pointless. Sure you challenged yourself, but did you grow closer to the Lord? That is what Lent is actually about. If we aren't growing closer to God, then we are missing the point of Lent. Lent is not a time to get healthy or break habits just for the sake of doing so, but rather to unite ourselves closer with God. This is something I struggled with for much of my life. 




QUESTION OF THE WEEK

St. Mark's Gospel of Jesus being tempted in the desert is very short, only two sentences long. However, it is just as clear from his telling of the story as it is in the longer versions. Jesus leaves the desert with a strong message, "Repent, and believe in the good news." We need to understand these words to understand what Jesus is asking of us.

"Repent" means more than counting up our sins and saying we are sorry. To repent means to take a serious look at not just what we have done, but the person we have become. Jesus is asking us to pay attention to how we are living our lives. How do we see ourselves? What are we all about? Why do we go to school, to work, do chores, or shuffle to scouts and soccer? What is our purpose? In this world, we are often identified by what we do and what we have. We are a success if we do well in school or at our job, save a lot of money or have a lot of life's toys.

Jesus asks us to see ourselves as God created us—a much-loved child, uniquely gifted, created to love as God loves. God considers us a success if— with Jesus' help—we become the person we were created to be, bringing God's love to the world. God gave Moses the Ten Commandments; they were part of God's covenant with the chosen people. In the new covenant, Jesus tells us we are God's children. He let's us know that we are expected to do more than just follow God's law. Jesus gives us a new attitude with the Beatitudes. "Blessed are the poor in spirit..." As God's children we are expected to carry Jesus' light and his loving, forgiving attitude to the world. That is the gospel Jesus proclaimed. This is the Good News.

What would the world be like if I live as God wants me to? How can I create greater peace and harmony in my home?


