



Confirmation Program Requirements

Confirmation 1:

- Attend Life Teen every Sunday (up to FOUR absences may be excused without having to repeat the year).
- Complete Make-up assignments for every missed Life Night and turn in the following Sunday.
- Complete all Confirmation Paperwork including: **Six month** copy of Baptism Certificate, Inscription Promise, Service Log.
- Complete 4 service projects rooted in the corporal and spiritual works of mercy which take at least 2+ hours. Outside activities **must** be pre-approved by the youth minister to be counted.
- Keep a weekly prayer journal recording when you prayed, how you grew from your prayer, and how you chose to pray (rosary, lectio divina, etc.). A **completed prayer journal** can be used in place of make-up work for missed classes.
- Attend an approved retreat, camp, or conference with St. Mary of the Expectation within your Conf. 1 yr.

Confirmation 2:

- Attend Chosen every Sunday (up to FOUR absences may be excused without having to repeat the year). Attending Life Teen once a month (and/or 8 total times) is also required.
- Complete Make-up assignments for every missed Chosen and turn in the following Sunday.
- Complete all Confirmation Paperwork including: **Six month** copy of Baptism Certificate, Sponsor Form, Confirmation Saint Project (due November 13, 2022), Confirmation Name Form, Inscription Promise, and Service Log.
- Complete 3 service projects rooted in the corporal and spiritual works of mercy which take at least 2+ hours. Outside activities **must** be pre-approved by the youth minister to be counted.
- Keep a weekly prayer journal recording when you prayed, how you grew from your prayer, and how you chose to pray (rosary, lectio divina, etc.) A **completed prayer journal** can be used in place of make-up work for missed classes.
- Attend the Confirmation 2 retreat with St. Mary to be held February 11th-12th, 2023 @ The CRC.
- Attend the review class the Sunday evening before your Confirmation.
- Attend the Confirmation rehearsal with sponsor the day before your Confirmation.
- Attend Confirmation!!! Dress Code (for candidate and sponsor): Dress should be "Sunday Best" in keeping with the dignity of the liturgical celebration. Coat and tie for men and dresses for women is considered appropriate. Dresses should be knee length or longer. Low cut and revealing clothing is not appropriate. Dress pants and a blouse for women is also considered appropriate.

Inscription Promise

I _____ (PRINT NAME CLEARLY), a member of St. Mary of the Expectation Parish, desire to affirm my belief in Jesus and His Church.

Therefore I ask to become a Candidate for the Sacrament of Confirmation and to enter the program of preparation being offered by this parish.

- ✿ I understand that I will be considered a candidate for Confirmation only after I turn in a copy of my 6th month baptismal certificate, turn in all other corresponding forms by their due dates, and complete all those guidelines outlined in the *Youth Ministry & Confirmation Handbook*.
- ✿ To the best of my ability, I agree to take part in the activities that make up the program of preparation.
- ✿ I understand that this Confirmation preparation program is a process that encompasses formal catechesis and I agree to attend two retreats, as required by the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston. I understand the importance of making every effort to attend the retreats offered by St. Mary of the Expectation Parish.
- ✿ If for some reason I am unable to attend a retreat, I will contact another parish or facility to attend a makeup retreat. I will also provide documentation of my attendance.
- ✿ I am aware of the attendance policy; that I am allowed 4 excused absences per year. I am aware that I **MUST** complete makeup work for every night I miss. I am aware that it is *my responsibility* to request makeup work and turn it into the director of youth ministry *promptly*! Failure to adhere to this attendance policy could result in repeating the year of Confirmation preparation.
- ✿ I accept responsibility to open my mind and heart to the Holy Spirit during this journey of growth and preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation.
- ✿ I understand that the keeping of this inscription promise during the preparation program is an indication of intent and readiness on my part for the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Choosing a Confirmation Name

The Saints are a beautiful example for us of how to live a faithful life. Choosing a Confirmation name is a great opportunity to learn more about the Saints and ask for their intercession as you continue to live out your “Yes” to God. In choosing a Confirmation Saint, you are choosing someone to pray for you in heaven as you model your life after them on earth. The name you choose will be the name the bishop calls you by when you receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Choose a Saint whose life inspires you or one that has qualities you admire, such as chastity, courage, or faithfulness.

Choosing a Confirmation name is a tradition of the Church. We see in scripture that Jesus often called people by a new name when they decided to follow Him. Choosing a new name was a sign of their rebirth in Christ and the Church. Simon became Peter, Abram became Abraham, and Saul became Paul to name just a few examples from scripture.

If you were baptized with a Catholic Christian or Saint name, after prayer and discernment, you may decide to retain your baptismal name. If a baptized name is a name foreign to Christian sensibility, then it is advisable that a name be chosen which reflects a recognized saint of the Church, a person from scripture or a Christian role model [cf Canon #855].

Please do the following when picking your Confirmation Name:

- 1) **Research:** take time to research the Saints and find some that interest you. The internet provides vast resources and information on the Saints. You may also want to ask your sponsor, parents, catechists, or youth minister for guidance in choosing your Confirmation name. There are also many great books and parish resources. Be sure to discuss your Confirmation name with your sponsor.
- 2) **Pray:** take time to pray about your Confirmation name. Ask some of the Saints that interest you for intercession as you discern which name to choose.
- 3) **Choose:** Once you have chosen your Confirmation Name, be sure to fill out the Confirmation Name Form and turn it into the parish office.

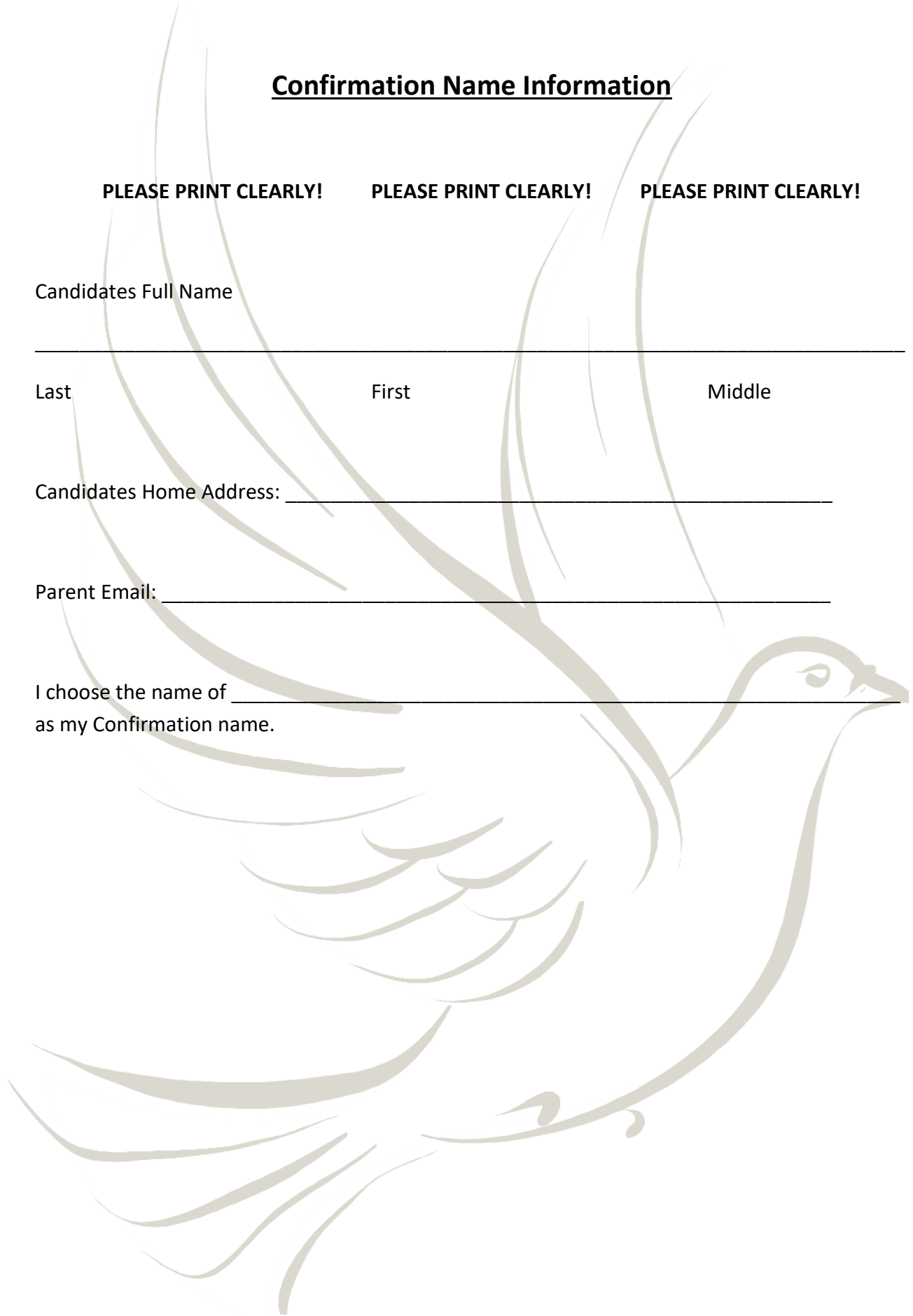

Confirmation Saint Project

(Confirmation Year 2 Only)

Each candidate must complete a creative presentation, about their chosen saint. The following information should be included:

- General Information: Name, Birthday, Feast Day, where they were from, are they a patron saint and if so who do they represent.
- Some background information about the saint, such as what are some of the things they are known for or important events in their lives. This should be at least one typed page.
- A Picture of the Saint.
- A quotation from the saint, some interesting facts about the saint, or specific prayer to the saint.
- An explanation of why you chose this saint and how this saint may pertain to your life, things about the saint that you found to be inspirational to you.

Make sure that your poster is clearly labeled with your name on it.

These posters will be shared with your peers and small group leader, so please make them neat and attractive and preferably have your information and explanation typed or neatly handwritten. If you need any supplies to complete your project such as poster board, markers, etc. please let the youth minister know and we will try to obtain those items for you.
