In this fifth week of Lent, we are presented with the story of the raising of Lazarus (John 11). Jesus demonstrates his divine authority by calling Lazarus, who had been dead for four days, back to life. This miracle reveals Jesus' identity as the Son of God and foreshadows his resurrection.

Jesus calls our names, too. He calls us out of the darkness of sin to live in his light. Just as Lazarus was brought back to life, we, too, can experience a spiritual rebirth through our faith in Jesus Christ. Jesus is stronger than anything or situation that we might face. **Jesus, increase our trust in you!**

Let us pray for the courage and strength to continue this Lenten journey, trusting in God's promise of new life. **Jesus, renew our minds, heal our wounds, and revive our spirits** so we may live more fully in your love and grace.

Shadow Stations: Last year was my first opportunity to participate in the Shadow Stations of the Cross that our middle school students put on. They are very moving and helped me pray while contemplating our Lord's Passion. Consider attending this year - Tuesday, March 19, at 6:00 pm in the Church.

plan to participate in the services at St. Gerard or wherever you will be traveling.

Blessing of Easter food baskets: Consider joining Deacon Phil and myself on Holy Saturday morning to bless the food you will use for your Easter celebration. The Easter food basket blessing is an old Eastern European tradition that has spread to families of all ethnicities and backgrounds. A traditional basket will include many of the following: eggs, butter, meat, bread, cheese, wine, and sweets. Feel free to be creative. THE THIRD SCRUTINY



Today at the 11 am Mass, the adults preparing for baptism (called "the Elect") participate in the last of the three "Scrutiny Rites". Scrutiny Rites are ceremonies by which the Elect examine their lives in order to be free to fully accept the Lord's saving power in the waters of baptism. The word "scrutiny" means a close examination or study. The Elect will closely examine their lives in light of God's Word. What might need to be changed in order to follow Him better? What is getting in the way of having a solid relationship with Him? What are they already doing well that should be affirmed? The Gospel we will hear is of John's account of the raising of Lazarus from the dead (John 11:1-45). Jesus knew the danger he was putting himself in by going back to Judea just after he was nearly stoned to death a few verses prior to this passage. He didn't let anything get in the way of doing the will of His Father. With a commanding voice he exclaimed, "Lazarus, come out!", and the dead man came back to life. Though it is the Elect who directly participate in this Rite, the rest of us can benefit by examining our own lives. Is there something in you that needs to be brought back to life again? What would you like to ask the Lord to do for you? Let us take some time to pray and closely examine our lives so we can grow together in Christ with the Elect.

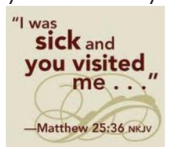

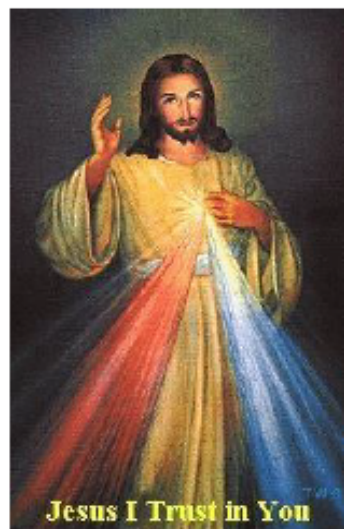
