Dear Sacred Heart Family,

Friday, January 22nd is the 43rd Anniversary of the Supreme Court decision, Roe v. Wade, which legalized abortion. Since that time, approximately 50 million abortions have been performed just in the United States, a truly tragic number.

The tragedy of abortion is not just a women's issue. A study that was done on women who have had an abortion revealed that more than 50% of them cited concerns about their relationship or single motherhood as a reason for their abortions. The report said, "These relationship problems included a partner's drinking, physical abuse, unfaithfulness, unreliability, immaturity, and absence (often due to incarceration or responsibilities to his other children). Many of these women were disappointed because their partner had reacted to the pregnancy by denying paternity, breaking off communication with them, or saying that they did not want the child." Our prayers for the women who are contemplating abortion must also include the fathers of these children. But our prayers must be accompanied by our support for those in this situation. CareNet Pregnancy Center in Leonardtown (301-475-5333) provides free assistance for women facing unplanned pregnancies. Please consider supporting them or spreading the news.

While our faith tells us in no uncertain terms that abortion in wrong, we also know that the mercy of God is greater than our sins. Many women have found great healing in receiving forgiveness for their abortions through Confession and also through Project Rachel, a post-abortion healing ministry sponsored by the Archdiocese of Washington that offers compassionate help to men and women who have experienced emotional and or spiritual pain after abortion. Their confidential helpline is 301-853-4565.

The other good news is that the number of abortions is declining and more and more young people are becoming Pro-Life. Thousands of men and women from across the United States will converge in DC this Friday for the March for Life. Our Archdiocese also sponsors a Youth Rally and Mass for Life which fills the Verizon Center with 20,000 young people. It became so large that another Mass for youth is held at the DC National Guard Armory near RFK.

This Friday, please offer prayers and sacrifices for the healing of so many children and women and men abortion has wounded. Pray that abortion, like slavery which also once denied that others were a human being, may be relegated to the dustbin of history.
