#### Dear Sacred Heart Family,

This week as we enter the month of November, our thoughts turn towards the end of time. On November 1st, we celebrate All Saints' Day (a Holy Day of Obligation) as we rejoice with our brothers and sisters who cooperated so well with God's grace that they are now saints. On November 2nd, we celebrate All Souls' Day as we pray for our brothers and sisters who are still in need of being perfected by God's grace before they can enter heaven and become saints. On November 12th, there will be a special Mass at Sacred Heart at 6:30pm to pray for the deceased from both Sacred Heart and Holy Angels parishes who have passed in the last year, and all others who have been buried at Sacred Heart Cemetery since last November. On November 20th, we celebrate the last Sunday in Ordinary Time – the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, and recall that He will come again at the end of time.

These special occasions in November help each of us recall what the Church calls the Four Last Things – death, judgment, heaven and hell. The world as we experience it will pass away, and Jesus will return to establish His kingdom over a new heavens and a new earth. Each of our lives on this earth will also end some day and we will be judged by the Lord. Based upon our choices in this life, we will either have chosen eternal happiness with our Father in heaven as saints or eternal separation from Him in hell. While many of us choose the Lord imperfectly through our actions, there is still hope for us. A final purification in purgatory is provided for us by our Father to transform us into the saints He created us to be. Souls in this state of purification can really be helped by us on earth through our prayers, our sacrifices and having Masses celebrated for them.

In addition, the Church, from the treasury of graces Jesus and the saints have earned through their lives, allows each of us to apply those graces for a soul in Purgatory in a special way. We can obtain an indulgence for them, which is a way to reduce the purification one undergoes in Purgatory (which is experienced as suffering). By obtaining an indulgence for a soul in purgatory, they are able to enter into heaven.

One special way we can obtain a plenary indulgence for a departed loved one is by visiting a cemetery (any cemetery – it doesn't have to be the one they are buried in) on any day between November 1<sup>st</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup>, praying, even if only mentally, for them, and then by praying for the Pope, and by receiving Communion and going to Confession soon thereafter. If you

want to obtain an indulgence every single day from November 1<sup>st</sup> -8<sup>th</sup>, (to help more people) one has to do all the above <u>each</u> day, though you only need to go to Confession once to obtain several plenary indulgences. One last condition is needed to obtain this indulgence: to be inwardly sorry for one's own sins with a resolution to try one's best to not sin, even in small matters.

I pray that we use this month to reflect on what is most important in life – life with God in eternal happiness as one of His saints, and to dedicate ourselves to praying for any soul in Purgatory, especially those who have no one to pray for them.
