Liturgical changes starting next Sunday, November 7th

1. Sign of Peace – While it is prudent to continue respecting each other by limiting “germ trade”, I believe that it is time to return the Sign of Peace to our Eucharistic celebration. Please do not get offended if some choose not to shake hands. Rather, share some other sign of peace...a wave, a head nod, a bow, a smile...any appropriate way to acknowledge each other and offering Christ’s peace.
2. Kneeling after the Lamb of God until the Great Amen – We had planned to introduce this change last year; however, given the radical changes in the life of the diocese, I decided not to make any changes at that time. At this time, I would like to ask St. Andrew Parish to make this change in conformity with the rest of the Diocese of Dodge City and in accord with the wishes of Bishop John.

Number 43 in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal states:

“In the Dioceses of the United States of America, they should kneel beginning after the singing or recitation of the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy) until after the Amen of the Eucharistic Prayer, except when prevented on occasion by ill health, or for reasons of lack of space, of the large number of people present, or for another reasonable cause. However, those who do not kneel ought to make a profound bow when the Priest genuflects after the Consecration. The faithful kneel after the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) unless the Diocesan Bishop determines otherwise.”
