Widow's Might - It was almost ten years ago that I experienced firsthand a power that is greater than anything that this world has to offer. At St. Mary's, we have a tradition on the last Sunday of Advent, after a brief homily, everyone leaves their pew and engages with their fellow parishioners wishing them a Merry Christmas and exchanging handshakes and hugs. That Sunday, our family dispersed into multiple corners of the church, but my wife and I stayed close to each other, firmly holding hands just as we had been doing for the past several weeks. We held a secret that burdened our hearts and souls. Then she appeared. With a parting of the crowd and with a warm smile, she approached us having a determined look in her eyes. Dorothy Wyant was small in stature, advanced in years, but overflowing with grace and holiness. We met in the center aisle, and she took the hands of my wife in hers and said, "Are you okay? Something is not right, and I want to know what I can do". At that moment, the floodgates opened, and tears and sobs took over as we told her of our heartache. We had just received the news about the new life forming within my wife's womb and a test revealed not only what appeared to be markers for down syndrome, but that there was what they termed a "catastrophic heart defect" that would be tough to treat and that "terminating" this life would be the best for everyone. Dorothy paused and smiled with not just her mouth, but her entire being and said, "I will pray for you and your baby starting right now and be assured that everything will be alright". From that moment and for the next eight years, Dorothy prayed for our daughter, and I am certain that the intercessions continue before the throne of grace and in the presence of the Lord with whom she had a deep and loving relationship. Everything was indeed alright. Our daughter was delivered with the heart defect but had a successful surgery within months correcting everything that was amiss. The obstacles that Down syndrome throws her way and ours creep up from time to time, but we have been enriched with blessings and graces that Dorothy assured us were dispensed from the hand of God Himself due to our faithfulness. Although a widow for several decades and hobbled with various physical limitations, Dorothy lived a life centered and full of Faith that God would provide what was needed for all those whom she kept close in prayer. This 32nd Sunday of Ordinary Time is a showcase of the power of women with great faith. In the first reading, we have the Widow of Zarephath whom amid a nationwide famine is preparing the last meal for her and an only son. Two sticks are all she had to cook her handful of flour and the last drops of oil in the jug. But Elijah challenges her to believe and trust in the promise of God. Elijah delivers the word of the Lord that they may not have everything they want and desire in life, but that everything that they NEED will be supplied. She trusted and with great faith arose every morning to find just enough to feed them for that day. Every day the miracle occurred, and every twenty-four hours God graced her with the opportunity to say, "Yes, I believe and trust in you". In the gospel, we hear of a lovely encounter with another widow that not only trusted in the power of God to supply her needs, but how she in turn extended those blessings to others. While the crowd of temple goers poured their monetary offering into the chests out of calculated giving, she gave all. "For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her WHOLE livelihood." (Mark 12:44) Jesus wanted His disciples to see and witness firsthand what it means to be "ALL IN" for God. We don't know either of the widows' names nor can we visit the tombs or monuments erected in their honor. However, the legacy of faith they left behind in their families and those whom they touch is priceless and life altering. Every morning we can arise refreshed in the consolation that although we might not get any of what we want or desire, God is good all the time and He will shower us with what we need to carry the crosses that burden us. We too, like Dorothy, can gather our two sticks or produce our two coins and be not afraid to use them in enriching the lives of so many other souls thirsting for the life-giving waters of Divine Mercy and grace. †
