# **OPPORTUNITY FOR INDULGENCES**

#### ALL SOULS DAY

#### Visit to a Cemetery

An *indulgence*, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. The indulgence is *plenary* each day from the 1st to the 8th of November; on other days of the year it is *partial*.

#### Office of the Dead

A partial indulgence is granted to the faithful, who devoutly recite Lauds or Vespers of the Office of the Dead.

#### **Eternal Rest Prayer**

*Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. - Partial indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory.* 

#### Visit to a Church on All Souls Day

A *plenary indulgence*, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who on the day dedicated to the Commemoration of all the faithful departed piously visit a church. In visiting the church, it is required that one *Our Father* and the *Creed* be recited.

# NATIONAL VOCATION AWARENESS WEEK

#### NOVEMBER 1ST - 6TH

#### This year, Vocation Awareness Week begins on All Saints Day, reminding us that we need saints in every vocation!

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP - ENCOURAGEMENT IS KEY

What can you do to inspire vocations? Of course, parents should create a faith-filled home environment. Parents, teachers and catechists should teach kids about marriage, holy orders, and consecrated life.

For all of us, after prayer, the number one thing, by far, is to *invite*. In CARA's study of the 2020 ordination class, 89% of brand-new priests said they were encouraged to consider seminary by their parish priest, a friend, or another parishioner.

*Another parishioner*. That's you. When you think, "There's something special about that young man," say something! Look for an appropriate moment to draw him aside and let him know what you see. Say, "If God has called you to be a priest, I think you'd make a great one."

#### NOW AS THEN, SELFLESS SISTERS SAVE LIVES

During the 1918 fu pandemic, thousands of religious sisters, many with no formal medical training, tended to the sick and dying, often in terrible conditions. "I have never seen a greater demonstration of real charity or self-sacrifice than has been given by the sisters in their nursing of the sick," said the mayor of Philadelphia a century ago.

Likewise, in New York City in the 1980s, during the height of the AIDS epidemic, Mother Teresa set up a house for men dying of the disease. They were tended round the clock by her quiet sisters, who in their blue-striped habits truly lived by their founder's guiding scripture: "Whatever you do for the least of these, you do unto Me." Today sisters have once again risen to the challenge, especially in third-world countries where the Covid-stricken poor cannot afford medical care. As one sister said, "We're women who anticipate the dawn while facing the darkness...we can draw on our own spiritual resources to be nourishers of hope."

May many young Catholic women open their heats to this heroic vocation!

# ST. MARY'S PARISH FESTIVAL SUNDAY, JANUARY 31, 2021

Believe it or not, it is already time to start preparing for the Parish Festival. Due to other community events and the availability of the Victoria Community Center, we have an earlier date this year. Your help is needed as we prepare for the festival before the busy Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays. There won't be much time afterwards!

As everyone is aware, due to the current COVID pandemic, we will have to make some changes to the festival. Certain decisions on the format of the festival will need to be made once we are closer to the date of the festival. At this point, we are looking at the possibility of having a ticketed event that would only last about 2 hours, so we can limit the size and interaction of the crowd. Regardless of what we end up doing, here are some things we can start working on:

1. **Donations for the Raffle** - Consider making a monetary donation to the raffle. Typically, we have Visa gift cards as our prizes along with other special gift cards. Donations of all sizes are welcome and may be combined with other donations to make bigger prizes. Unless you have a specific request or arrangement, allow us to buy the gift cards. You can drop off your raffle donation at the parish office or in the collection plate with a note on it.

#### We currently have received \$2,300.00 from 5 people for the raffle. Our goal is \$8,000.00

2. <u>Meal Expenses</u> - Remember that delicious BBQ brisket meal from last year? I know, I do! We have Mike Pozzi booked for this upcoming festival for the same wonderful meal. Even if we cannot have a large indoor meal, we can still sale plates to go. With your donation towards the meal expenses, the sale of these plates will give us a greater profit! Consider making a donation to help cover these expenses. You can drop off your meal donation at the parish office or in the collection plate with a note on it.

#### We currently have received \$700.000 from 2 people for the Meal Expenses. Our goal is \$12,500.00

3. <u>Live Auction</u> - With the possibility of a briefer, smaller, in-person event, we will greatly limit our live auction items to include those that have greater appeal. 
