We will not have exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Christmas Day and New Years Day.

EXPLANATION OF ART ON THE FRONT COVER

John Collier's contemporary depiction of the Annunciation brings the story of Mary's encounter with the Angel Gabriel into our present reality. Collier's Annunciation stands on the shoulders of tradition, depicting the encounter in such a way that includes the standard symbols of the past. We see Mary and the angel face to face. Mary holding a book as the symbol of her piety. We see the lily as a symbol of her purity, the pane window as the symbol of her virginity, and the dove perching in the background as the symbol of the Holy Spirit. These symbols are the familiar language of many of Annunciation scenes and connect this work to those from the great masters of the past. While using these familiar elements, Collier retells the story for our present day. Mary is a young schoolgirl with a pony tail, still in school uniform, and she lives in a suburban neighborhood. Her shoes are playfully untied. She must have just slipped back into them to come to the door. In bringing together past and present, Collier invites us to see the gospel scene, not as a distant story, but as one unfolding in our lives here and now. As the story unfolds, the encounter between Mary and the angel reveals even deeper meaning. Mary is a young schoolgirl with unties shoelaces, but she is also a figure of strength, steadfastness, and faith. She looks squarely at the angel, who in contrast bows reverently before her, paying homage to God's grace manifest in His lowly handmaid. The angels presence is subtly liturgical. In his dress and posture, he resembles an acolyte, serving at the altar, ready to adore the presence of the Lord who will, in a moment, become flesh in the body of this young girl. The angel, as server, is a beautiful anticipation of Christ's bodily presence in our midst, first welcomed through the faithful 'yes' of Mary. Standing at the door with Mary and Gabriel, we are at a liturgy, gathered into one body to encounter the real presence of Christ in our midst. Like Mary, we are called to say 'ves' to this moment, and offer ourselves to await His arrival.

DONATION INFORMATION

Nonprofit CARES ACT CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTION CHANGES

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act, which became law on March 27, 2020, made several changes to charitable contribution limitation rules for individuals and corporations. Here are the details:

FOR INDIVIDUALS:

- Individuals who take the standard deduction on their tax return (non-itemizers) can contribute up to \$300 cash to most 501(c)(3) charitable organizations and claim a new "above the-line" deduction on their 2020 taxes. Previously, there was no charitable contribution tax deduction available for taxpayers who did not itemize deductions.
- Individuals who itemize their deductions can deduct up to 100% of their adjusted gross income (AGI) for cash contributions to most 501(c)(3) organizations for 2020. The deduction was previously capped at 60% of AGI for cash contributions.

FOR CORPORATIONS:

- Corporate donors may also make charitable contributions, and in 2020, corporations may increase their corporate tax deduction from 15% to 25% of taxable income.
- Corporations that donate food inventory during 2020 may increase their charitable contribution deduction from 15% to 25% of taxable income.

- 4. Ask everyone at the table the best part of their day during the meal conversation.
- 5. While at the table, discuss what it might have been like on the night Jesus was born... Might it have been cold? Was it dark? Who might have been with Mary & Joseph?

Prayer after Meals:

We give you thanks, almighty God, for all your benefits, who loves and reigns for ever and ever. Amen. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

- 1. Consider making a Jesse Tree or adding ornaments to your own tree that reflect the faithfulness of God found throughout the Bible.
- 2. Celebrate these December feast days: St. Nicholas, Our Lady of Guadalupe, and the Feast of the Holy Family!


