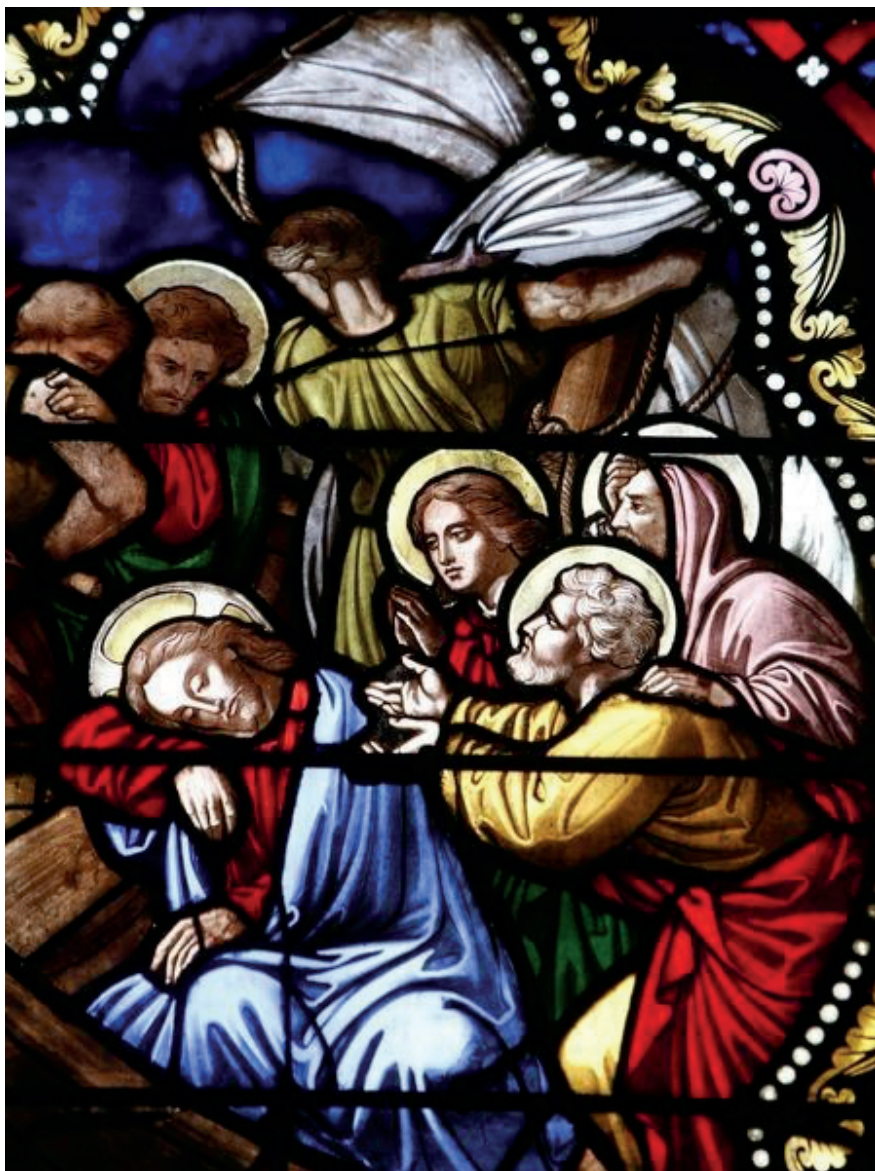

Notes on the Processional Hymn:

The first three stanzas of this hymn appeal to the Trinity with Scripture passages where each Person of the Blessed Trinity controlled the sea, imploring "O hear us when we cry to Thee for those in peril on the sea." The first stanza refers to God's discourse with Job in today's first reading, in which the Lord asks "Who shut within doors the sea, when it burst forth from the womb; when I ... said: Thus far shall you come but no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stilled?" (Job 38:8, 11) The second stanza refers to two occasions when Jesus calmed the raging sea: when He walked on the water (Mark 6:45-52), and today's gospel when He slept through a storm until His terrified disciples woke Him (Mark 4:35-41). The third stanza alludes to Creation, when "The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters." (Genesis 1:2) The final stanza summarizes the hymn and promises continued praise "from land and sea."

The name of the tune, MELITA, is named after the island where Paul was shipwrecked (Acts 28:1 KJV; its modern name is "Malta"). It is a fitting name for a tune associated with a text about safety on the seas.

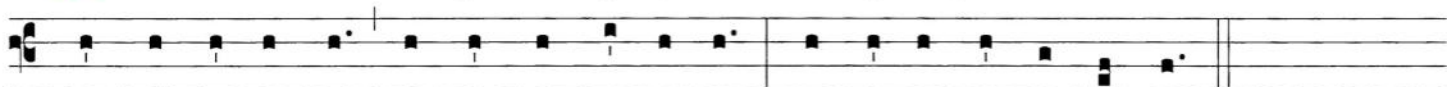

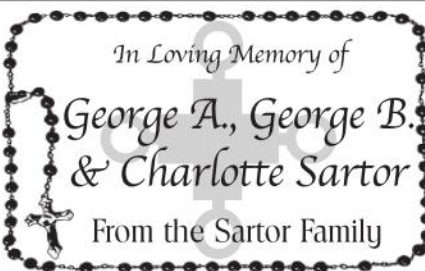
