# The Shape of the Liturgy

The End is Near

The Church Year is drawing to an end now. In the first part of the Church Year, in our Scripture readings for Mass we started back in Advent and gone on through Ascension. During this first part of the year (roughly December through May) during the fall and winter, we have re-lived the earthly life of Jesus: His birth - baptism - ministry - passion - death - resurrection – and finally ascension.

Then the second half of the Church Year (roughly June through November) beginning with the Solemnity of Pentecost, celebrates the birth of the Church of Christ, the Catholic Church. And then in these spring and summer Sundays after Pentecost (called Ordinary Time), our Scripture readings for Mass present us with the ministry of Jesus: His teaching, his miracles, the stories He told (called parables), his healing of people who were ill or possessed of demons. As the first half of the Church Year teaches us the life of Christ, the second part the Church Year asks for our response to Jesus as his disciples, how we live our lives as Christian people.

Now in these months of October and November. we're coming once again to the end of this Church Year. And our Scripture readings for Mass reflect that: they're about things of the end. In theology, that is called the "Eschaton", which is a word in Greek which means – you guessed it - "the end." Eschatology - things having to do with the end. The end of life, of time, the end of this existence as we've known it here, and heading on toward

judgment and eternity. The things we can take with us and the things we cannot take with us.

The things we cannot take with us are obvious. But there is one thing we can take with us, and that is the love and kindness we have shown to others during this life. As Holy Scripture reminds us, "Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God" (Hebrews 13:16). One of the Church Fathers expressed it this way: each act of kindness — larger or small — we show to others, turns us more and more into the image of Christ. As we move through these last Sundays of this Church Year, may we all take this opportunity to grow more and more Christlike through our acts of kindness






