

The celebrant invites the gathered assembly to pray and, after a brief silence,
proclaims the prayer of the day. The Opening Prayer gives a context for the celebration.

POSTLUDE

The Shape of the Liturgy

"Love Divine, All Loves Excelling"

For Mass today as we sing for the offertory "Love Divine All Loves Excelling", we encounter one of the many beautiful Wesley Hymns. Four generations of the family of John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist Church, were gifted writers of hymns, leaving to us almost thirty hymns, all of which would be familiar to us. All of them being devout Christian men, their hymns always strike a note of praise and redemption. That is certainly true of our offertory hymn today by Charles Wesley, a brother of John.

It is one of nineteen hymns which Charles Wesley composed, and has become famous throughout the Christian world. In fact, it was used when, on April 29, 2011, millions of people around the world turned on their televisions to watch one of the most anticipated spectacles of the year: the wedding of Prince William and Kate Middleton. The ceremony featured a number of hymns, one of which was "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling," a hymn that is both appropriate and seemingly paradoxical for a wedding. This ceremony was so celebrated because it represented the "dream" for romance - a prince finding his princess, true loves coming together, and a couple rising above the odds to be together. This, we argue so easily, is love. And yet this hymn reorients us to see that this beautiful wedding and marriage is only, and can only ever be, a reflection of the Love above all loves. We are only able to love one another because Christ first loved us. God is love, and we are the mirrors and bearers of that love to each other. Let us pray that we would continually be filled with Love, that we might bless each other, and become more and more like He who loves us.


ST. MARY'S ACTIVITY CENTER

An *indulgence*, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. The indulgence is *plenary* each day from the 1st to the 8th of November; on other days of the year it is *partial*.
