

The Annunciation Window at St. Mary's Church

"The angel went on to say to her: 'Do not fear, Mary. You have found favor with God. You shall conceive and bear a son and give him the name of Jesus."

This window was placed in 1907 and dedicated March 15, 1908.

COLLECT

The Introductory Rites conclude with the Opening Prayer, also called the Collect.

The celebrant invites the gathered assembly to pray and, after a brief silence,
proclaims the prayer of the day. The Opening Prayer gives a context for the celebration.

Pour forth, we beseech you, O Lord, your grace into our hearts, that we, to whom the Incarnation of Christ your Son was made known by the message of an Angel, may by his Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of his Resurrection. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Our gifts of bread and wine, representing ourselves, are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. Then the priest offers Christ, and ourselves in union with Christ, to God.



The Shape of the Liturgy

Savior of the Nations, Come

Our Processional hymn for this 4th Sunday of Advent, Savior of the Nations, Come, speaks to the time in which it was written and to our own time as well. It has its roots in the fourth century. As the story has come down to us, St. Ambrose, Bishop of Milan (340-397) was struggling with the Arian heresy which plagued the Church at that time. Arianism was so dangerous to the Faith because it denied the divinity of Jesus Christ. When the Byzantine Empress Justina, an Arian heretic herself, tried to invade one of St. Ambrose's church. He refused to hand over the house of God to those who believed this heresy. No doubt worried over military reprisal from the Empress, St. Ambrose gathered the flock into the Basilica of Portina in Milan, to sing Psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs as they turned to God, asking His help in their time of need. When the military entourage sent by the Empress arrived, the soldiers are said to have been so moved by the singing that they put down their weapons and joined in the singing themselves. This best-known hymn of St. Ambrose is based in part on John 1 and Luke 2. And so this hymn spoke to the time of St. Ambrose.



As to our own time, we too live in a time of heresy, a time which in many ways denies belief in God and in many ways is hostile to it. Most importantly, our modern society and culture have abandoned the Judeo-Christian principles on which our nation was built, and like a plant whose roots have been severed, we too are living through the consequences. The individual has become god, the only sin is inconvenience, a person's gender is decided day by day by the person, masculine and feminine pronouns are no longer acceptable, a biological man dressed in a woman's clothing goes into a woman's restroom, a reporter reports on Planned Parenthood selling fetal body parts and is persecuted himself to the extent of the law for his report. But enough of the "challenges" we live in, because like St. Ambrose before us, we too have hope. The Hope which came into our world in the Person, Jesus Christ, who is God with us and among us, and whose arrival which we will remember and celebrate now in a few days-time. And so most appropriately we sing today, *Savior of the Nations, Come*.
