

COLLECT

The Introductory Rites conclude with the Opening Prayer, also called the Collect.

The celebrant invites the gathered assembly to pray and, after a brief silence,
proclaims the prayer of the day. The Opening Prayer gives a context for the celebration.

O God, author of every mercy and of all goodness, who in fasting, prayer and almsgiving have shown us a remedy for sin, look graciously on this confession of our lowliness, that we, who are bowed down by our conscience, may always be lifted up by your mercy. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

In the Liturgy of the Word, the Church feeds the people of God from the table of his Word.
The Scriptures are the word of God, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.
In the Scriptures, God speaks to us, leading us along the path to salvation.

The scrutinies are rites for self-searching and repentance and have above all a spiritual purpose. This rite is meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the heart of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. The scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect her against temptation, and to give her strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life.

Our gifts of bread and wine, representing ourselves, are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. Then the priest offers Christ, and ourselves in union with Christ, to God.

The Shape of the Liturgy

When I Survey the Wondrous Cross

One Sunday afternoon the young Isaac Watts (1674-1748) was lamenting the deplorable hymns that were sung at church. At that time, metered renditions of the Psalms were intoned by a cantor and then repeated by the congregation, although often less than with enthusiasm. His father, the pastor of the church, rebuked his son with "I'd like to see you write something better!" As legend has it, young Isaac retired to his room and appeared several hours later with his first hymn, "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross, and it was enthusiastically received and sung at the Sunday evening service the same night.

Although the tale may be something less than fact, it does illustrate the point that the church is constantly in need of hymns of prayer, supplication, and praise. With over 600 hymns to his credit - many of them classics like "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" - Isaac Watts has rightfully earned the title "the Father of English Hymnody." In recent history, the hymn text has settled in with Lowell Mason's hymn tune "Hamburg," an adaptation of a five note (count them!) plainchant melody. Besides writing hundreds of hymn tunes, he was a church choir director, the president of Boston's Handel and Haydn Society, and a leading figure in music education.

The hymn "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" gives us much to contemplate during this Holy Season of Lent as our focus is on the Cross of Christ and is based on Galatians 6:14: "May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world".

PYSANKY - UKRAINIAN EASTER EGGS SIGN UP FOR CLASS ON MARCH 26TH

Ukrainian Easter Egg decorating has been handed down through generations of Ukrainians. They are famous for their colorful Easter Eggs (Pysanky). During Lent, Ukrainian Catholic women typically make upwards of 60 pysanky in anticipation of Easter Sunday. Easter eggs symbolize the resurrection and the promise of eternal life.

Legend has it that as long as pysanky are decorated; goodness will prevail over evil throughout the world.

Interested adults and teens are invited to learn the art of Pysanky in a hands-on class. We will be using a kistka, imported from Ukraine, to write Christian symbols onto the dyed eggs using hot beeswax. Each color of dye is preserved under the wax and will be revealed at the end of the process.






