

COLLECT

The Introductory Rites conclude with the Opening Prayer, also called the Collect.

The celebrant invites the gathered assembly to pray and, after a brief silence,
proclaims the prayer of the day. The Opening Prayer gives a context for the celebration.

O God, who on this day, through your Only Begotten Son, have conquered death and unlocked for us the path to eternity, grant, we pray, that we who keep the solemnity of the Lord's Resurrection may, through the renewal brought by your Spirit, rise up in the light of life. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Our gifts of bread and wine, representing ourselves, are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. Then the priest offers Christ, and ourselves in union with Christ, to God.

The Shape of the Liturgy

The Feast of the Resurrection - Easter Sunday

THE SIX BAPTISMAL PROMISES

This Easter Sunday during the Mass, there is something new and perhaps unexpected - we renew our baptism promises. Why do we do this you might ask? Well, there several reasons. First of all, let's recall the graces we receive in this Sacrament. Baptism removes all our sin, it makes us children of God, incorporates us into his Church, the Catholic Church, and confers on us sanctifying grace, which stays in the soul, makes the soul holy, and gives the soul supernatural life. In short, baptism is the time and occasion when God the Holy Spirit comes to live within us and our life as Christians begin.

And when we were baptized, promises were made by our parents if we were too young to consent, or if we had reached the "age of consent" we made these promises for ourselves. Many of us probably haven't thought much about those baptismal promises in years, if at all. So today is a good reminder. During Mass today, the priest asks us first three negative questions:

- 1) Do you renounce Satan, 2) And all his works, 3) And all his empty promises. And to each question we respond by saying "I do". In other words what we are turning our backs on. Then Father will ask us three positive questions:
- 1) Do you believe in God the Father, 2) in God the Son, and 3) in the Holy Spirit. In responding to these questions, we are reaffirming our loyalty to the obligations of being a disciple of Christ, and to the disciplines of our Catholic Faith. In other words, we are undertaking to model our lives on the life of Christ, in what we think, in what we say, in how we "love the Lord our God with all our heart and mind and soul, and our neighbors as ourselves."

Oddly enough, we Catholics can even take a leaf from the teachings of Martin Luther who taught that "we are to daily renew our baptism" and as such, when believers rise in the morning, they should proclaim "I am baptized into Christ."

Being a disciple of Jesus is about more than coming to Mass once a week, or for that matter, once a year. Mass renews the Presence of Christ within us, grounds us in God's Word and Christ's Presence in the Blessed Sacrament, and equips us for living out the other days of the week. The promises at baptism are promises, and people of integrity keep their promises. And of course, a person of integrity is a person who does what he says he will do.
