If you have only a moment, please stop by so I may have the opportunity to meet you. I look forward to serving the Church in this capacity and getting to know everyone I can from our parish!

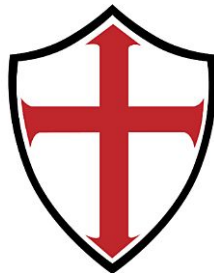

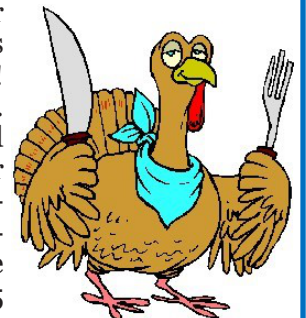
