

POSTLUDE

The Shape of the Liturgy

Processional Hymn: Faith of Our Fathers

Faith of our Fathers is the quintessential Catholic hymn. It was written in 1849 by Frederick William Faber (1814-1863) in memory of the Catholic martyrs who suffered during the reigns of Henry VIII (d. 1547) and Elizabeth I (d. 1601), and died by being beheaded or burned at the stake. These years were especially difficult and dangerous for people who remained Catholic. They were called recusants (from the Latin word meaning 'to refuse'), and received the Sacraments from Jesuit priests who were smuggled into England. They were hidden in "priest holes" which were tiny nooks the homes of the wealthy.

Raised in the Church of England, Father Faber came from a strict Calvinistic family background. He was educated at Oxford, and ordained in the Church of England in 1839. Influenced by the teaching of Cardinal John Henry Newman, Faber followed Newman into the Catholic Church in 1845, and served under Newman's supervision in the Oratory of St. Philip Neri*. Because he believed that Catholics should sing hymns like those written by John Newton and Charles Wesley, Faber wrote 150 hymns himself.

Creating poems and hymns were the work and mission of Father Faber. He wrote hymns that he believed would assist his fellow Christians with their faith and life. He penned roughly 150 such hymns in his lifetime, and in the opinion of many, his greatest creation was *Faith of Our Fathers*.

Henri Hemy (1818-1888), organist and composer, wrote the music for "Faith of Our Fathers". The arrangement was written in remembrance of St. Catherine of Alexandria, a fourth-century Christian lady who was sentenced to death because of her faith, and than is the reason the hymn tune is *St. Catherine*.

On a personal note, on a pilgrimage to Walsingham in 2010, we visited the Beddingfield Castle in Norfolk which was actually fitted with a "priest hole" – a small hidden and cramped nook where a Catholic household could hide Jesuit priests sent over from France to say Mass and administer the Sacraments to recusant families. It was a death sentence if you were discovered. I felt a profound sense of peace and blessing being in the actual place where in those days, a priest, if found, would be condemned to death. If you will permit me another personal and somewhat amusing note. I had in Episcopal seminary a professor who would not sing this hymn when it was chosen for morning chapel – because he knew which Faith it was talking to us about! (The Faith of the Council of Trent). Dr. Stanley was a great teacher of vast experience and learning, but sometimes we disagreed. So "when the roll is called up yonder" we two will have to discuss this further (that is hoping we will both make that roll call). But I suspect that even those 50+ years ago, I was already well on the path to following Cardinal Newman home to Rome.

*The Congregation of the Oratory was founded by St. Philip Neri (1515–1595) in Rome. The new community was to be a congregation of secular priests living under obedience but bound by no vows. In 1842 Newman withdrew to the village of Littlemore near Birmingham with a small group of followers, and lived in semi-monastic conditions patterned on St. Philip Neri's model. Speaking of Neri, whom he called, "the saint of joy", Pope St. John Paul II said, "As is well known, the saint used to put his teaching into short and wise maxims: 'Be good, if you can'. Fr. Faber described the Oratorian charism as "a spirituality of everyday life". May you and I also be "saints of joy" to all we meet. St. Francis de Sales said that "A sad saint would be a sorry saint."
