

In this ancient hymn, the gathered assembly joins the heavenly choirs
in offering praise and adoration to the Father and Jesus through the Holy Spirit.

COLLECT

The Introductory Rites conclude with the Opening Prayer, also called the Collect.

The celebrant invites the gathered assembly to pray and, after a brief silence,
proclaims the prayer of the day. The Opening Prayer gives a context for the celebration.

Almighty ever-living God, whose will is to restore all things in your beloved Son, the King of the universe, grant, we pray, that the whole creation, set free from slavery, may render your majesty service and ceaselessly proclaim your praise. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

We have entered the most important part of the Mass. This sequence of prayers contains the **consecration** which is the heart of the Mass. By the power of the Holy Spirit, through the words and actions of these prayers, the priest accomplishes the great work of the Mass: bringing Christ Himself down upon our altar, so that we may offer Him to God. Our gifts of bread and wine, representing ourselves, are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. Then the priest offers Christ, and ourselves in union with Christ, to God.

POSTLUDE

The Shape of the Liturgy

Processional Hymn: Praise to the Lord

Praise to the Lord, the Almighty is well chosen as our processional hymn for Mass today, as we come to the end of another liturgical year. Today ends our gospel readings from St. Luke in Cycle C, and we begin Cycle A with Gospel readings from St. Matthew. The hymn was originally written in German by Joachum Neander (1650-1680) in 1680 and was entitled Lobe den Herren, and has been praised as "a magnificent hymn of praise to God, perhaps the finest creation of its author, and of the first rank in its class."

The melody used by Neander, first published in 1665, exists in many versions and is probably based on a folk tune. The text paraphrases Psalm 103 and Psalm 150, and was translated into English by Catherine Winkworth (1827-1878). The common name given to the hymn tune is "Lobe den Herren".

Oddly enough, our Catholic hymnal at St. Mary's omits the eucharistic verse written by Percy Dearmer (1867 - 1936) - an Anglican!

Praise to the Lord, let us offer our gifts at the altar. Let not our sins and offenses now cause us to falter. Christ the high priest, bids us all join in his feast, victims with him on the altar.

The images of Dearmer's very Catholic text reflect the eucharistic theology of sacrifice and banquet, and the petitioner's self-offering and awareness of sin.

Catherine Winkworth (1827-1878) who, although she had a short life, was a prolific hymn writer and translator. She is noted for the beauty and clarity of her work, as her hymns and translations have stood the test of time, and remain with us and are familiar to us today.

On this the last Sunday of the Church Liturgical Year, perhaps it is sufficient for us today to simply reflect on all the blessings the Lord has showered upon us, to count them, and to thank Him for each and every one of them.
