# The Shape of the Liturgy

Communion Hymn: Lo, How A Rose E'er Blooming

"Es ist ein Ros entsprungen" (literally "A rose has sprung up") is usually translated into English as Lo, How a Rose e'er Blooming, with the rose used as a symbolic reference to the Virgin Mary. The hymn was originally written with two verses, the first of which combines the story of Luke 1-2 and Matthew 2 with their fulfillment of the prophecy of Isaiah 11:1 - "And there shall come forth a rod out of the stem of Jesse, and a Branch shall grow out of his roots." – which we as Christians understand as foretelling the Incarnation of Christ, and to the Tree of Jesse used as a symbolic device that depicts the descent of Jesus from Jesse of Bethlehem, the father of King David. Because of its prophetic theme, the hymn is especially appropriate during the Holy Season of Advent.

The second verse of the hymn, written in the first person, then explains to the listener the meaning of this symbolism: That Mary, the Mother of Jesus, is the rose (representing a small flower) that has sprung up to bring forth the Christ child, emphasizing the doctrine of the Virgin birth of Jesus.

Finally, the third verse introduces imagery from John 1 and describes the love of God for each of us through the Incarnation of Christ into our human world in the words fragrant, tender, sweet.

The hymn has its roots in an unknown author before the 17th century. It first appeared in print in 1599 and has since been published with a varying number of verses and in several translations. It is most commonly sung to a melody harmonized by the German composer Michael Praetorius in 1609.

This Advent Season of 2022, as we prepare once again to welcome the birth of Our Lord at Christmas, perhaps it is sufficient for us today after receiving Our Lord in Holy Communion, to simply quieten our minds and hearts and to rest in the beauty and reassurances of this sublime hymn.
