In this ancient hymn, the gathered assembly joins the heavenly choirs
in offering praise and adoration to the Father and Jesus through the Holy Spirit.

The Introductory Rites conclude with the Opening Prayer, also called the Collect.

The celebrant invites the gathered assembly to pray and, after a brief silence,
proclaims the prayer of the day. The Opening Prayer gives a context for the celebration.

We have entered the most important part of the Mass. This sequence of prayers contains the **consecration** which is the heart of the Mass. By the power of the Holy Spirit, through the words and actions of these prayers, the priest accomplishes the great work of the Mass: bringing Christ Himself down upon our altar, so that we may offer Him to God. Our gifts of bread and wine, representing ourselves, are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. Then the priest offers Christ, and ourselves in union with Christ, to God.

The Shape of the Liturgy

Offertory Hymn: Once in Royal David's City

Our offertory hymn for Christmas this year - Once in Royal David's City - was actually written as a children's hymn by Mrs. Cecil Frances Alexander in 1848. As wife of the Anglican Bishop of Ireland, she showed her concern for the disadvantaged people there by traveling many miles each day to visit the sick and the poor, providing food, warm clothes, and medical supplies. As a Christian lady and as a poet, Mrs. Alexander wrote poetry to help explain the Christian Faith, especially the Apostle's Creed, to children. In our Offertory Hymn for today, Mrs. Alexander turned into poetry the section of the Creed which tells us of Jesus as one "Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary." Each stanza explores part of the contrast between Jesus' divinity and humanity.



For instance, the first and second verses contrast the glory of heaven, from where He came, with the poverty of earth to which He came. The third verse speaks of the humanity of Jesus, that he shared our pains and sorrows. The hymn ends by reminding us of the love of God we see reflected in His Son Jesus, for each of us, and of our calling to share that love with whomever God sends into our lives not just at Christmas, but each of the other 364 days of coming year.



May I wish each and every one of you a Happy Christmas and a most blessed and good New Year of 2023. Don't forget to always put yourself in God's Hands, and in all things to count your blessings and to thank the Good Lord for them – and especially today – for the gift to us of His son Jesus.
