There will be no confessions on Holy Saturday, April 4, 2015 or Easter Sunday, April 5, 2015.

Spiritual Notes:

Mark's version of the Passion, perhaps some of the oldest gospel writings, emphasizes Jesus' suffering. Mark's audience is thought to be the Christians in Rome sometime in the 60's or early 70's. A significant event, the destruction of the temple by the Romans, occurred in AD 70. The emphasis on suffering would be appropriate for a community facing persecution itself. Mark tells us that after holding their own examination of Jesus, "The chief priests with the elders and the scribes" decided to present Jesus to Pontius Pilate, who represented Roman authority in Jerusalem. It is Pilate who can condemn Jesus to death, the outcome they are seeking. Mark's account of hearing before Pilate is sparse, but he tells us that "Pilate was amazed" by Jesus' lack of self defense. Offering to release Jesus as part of a Passover amnesty, Pilate encounters the animosity of the leaders. The chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release Barabbas, instead of Jesus. And though Pilate believes Jesus is innocent ("What evil has he done?"), he takes the path of least resistance by handing "him over to be crucified." Mark tells us that Pilate "had Jesus scourged" first sparing the details and then briefly describes the soldiers' mockery of Jesus: dressing him as a false king, they "kept striking his head... and spitting upon him." The repetitive action of the soldiers heightens their contempt for Jesus. At the scene of the crucifixion, we are told that three groups mocked him: "those passing by, "the chief priests, with the scribes" and "those who were crucified with him." Only after his death narrative do we hear of the faithful women who were present; Mark paints a scene in which Jesus is rejected by all. Jesus even cries out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Immediately following the death, the Roman centurion announces what we were first told in Mark's opening verse, "This man was the Son of God."

For Reflection: How does the annual reading of the Passion impact my spiritual life? Is there a specific detail that speaks to me more this year than in the past?



Notas Espirituales:

La versión de Marcos de la Pasión, tal vez algunos de los escritos más antiguos del Evangelio, hace hincapié en el sufrimiento de Jesús. Audiencia de Marcos se piensa que son cristianos de Roma en algún momento a finales de los años 60 o principios de los años 70. Un hecho relevante, la destrucción del templo por los romanos, se produjo en el año 70. El énfasis en el sufrimiento sería apropiado para una comunidad frente a la propia persecución. Marcos nos dice que después de la celebración de su propio examen de Jesús, "los jefes de los sacerdotes con los ancianos y los escribas" decidieron presentar a Jesús a Poncio Pilatos, quien representó a la autoridad romana en Jerusalén. Es Pilatos que puede condenar a Jesús también la muerte, el resultado que están buscando. El relato de la audiencia ante Pilatos de Marcos es escasa, pero él nos dice que "Pilatos estaba sorprendido" por la falta de defensa personal de Jesús. Ofreciendo soltar a Jesús como parte de una amnistía pascual, Pilatos se encuentra con la animosidad de los líderes. "Los jefes de los sacerdotes incitaron a la multitud para que pongan en libertad a Barrabás" en lugar de Jesús. Y aunque Pilatos cree que Jesús es inocente "¿Qué mal ha hecho?» - Se toma el camino de menor resistencia entregando a "él para ser crucificado.» Marcos nos dice que Pilatos "tenía Jesús azotado" primero, sin mucho detalle, y luego describe brevemente la burla de Jesús de los soldados: vistiéndolo como un falso rey, se "mantienen golpeándole la cabeza ... y escupen sobre él" .La acción repetitiva de los soldados aumenta su desprecio por Jesús. En la escena de la crucifixión, se nos dice que tres grupos se burlaban de él: "aquellos que pasan", "los jefes de los sacerdotes, con los escribas", y "los que crucificaron con él." Sólo después del relato de su muerte oímos de las mujeres fieles que estaban presentes; Marcos pinta una escena en la que Jesús es rechazado por todos. Jesús incluso gritó: "Dios mío, Dios mío, ¿por qué QUE ME HAS BANDONADO ?. Inmediatamente después de la muerte, el centurión romano anuncia lo que nos dijeron por primera vez en primer versículo de Marcos," Este hombre era el Hijo de Dios ."

Para reflexionar: ¿Cómo afecta la lectura anual de la Pasión afecta mi vida espiritual? ¿Hay un detalle específico que me habla más este año que en el pasado?
