Spiritual Notes:

Luke begins his second volume, Acts of the Apostles, by narrating Jesus' ascension. His first look was concerned with "all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up." Now he begins the story of Jesus' disciples continuing the mission. Before his ascension, Jesus had promised them that they "will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you" empowered by the Spirit, they are to be "witnesses in Jerusalem... and to the ends of the earth." Their mission is our mission too, for we share in the same Spirit. Writing to the Ephesians, Paul prays "that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ...may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation." Christ Jesus, who was raised from the dead, sits at God's "right hand in the heavens." And he has dominion over all creation, even the heavenly beings above every principality, authority, power, and dominion. Here Paul starts to develop his image of the church as Christ's body. He will develop this idea further, reminding us that we who share in the one bread are called to become one body. Today's Gospel text, though accepted as inspired and canonical, is not found in some of the oldest manuscripts of Mark; some ancient manuscripts of Mark omit any mention of the risen Christ and his ascension. But without these events, the story of Jesus is incomplete. In today's text, Jesus commissions his disciples to "go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature." Then he "was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God." The disciples follow Jesus' command to go forth preaching the word, while the Lord worked with them.

For reflection: In what way can I witness to the Gospel in my everyday life? How effective do I think the Gospel would be without the resurrection?

Notas Espirituales: Séptimo Domingo de Pascua Mayo/17/2015

En el mundo bíblico, el número 12 simboliza las 12 tribus de Israel. Que Jesús selecciona 12 apóstoles indica que él está pensando en renovar la nación. Después de la muerte de Judas, los 11 apóstoles restantes consideraron que era importante mantener su número 12, por lo que seleccionaron su sucesor, Matías, "que nos acompañó todo el tiempo que el Señor Jesús venía y estaba entre nosotros." Para los apóstoles era importante que él también fuera un testigo presencial del ministerio de Jesús; su testimonio será confiable.

El autor de la Primera de Juan nos recuerda que "si Dios nos ha amado tanto, también nosotros debemos amarnos los unos a los otros." Para la comunidad de Juan, el mandamiento del amor está por encima de todos los demás. Nuestro autor habla como testigo y así puede "dar testimonio de que el Padre envió a su Hijo como salvador." Dei Verbum del Concilio Vaticano II (Constitución dogmática sobre la Divina Revelación) nos dice que "Jesús perfeccionó la revelación." Nuestra tarea como iglesia y como creyentes individualmente es tratar de entender mejor la palabra de Dios para nosotros y ponerla en práctica en nuestras vidas.

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús ora al Padre por sus discípulos, que "están en el mundo, mientras yo voy a ti," es decir "que sean uno como nosotros somos uno." Su tarea es continuar su obra: "Como tú me enviaste al mundo, así les envío al mundo." Sabiendo que enfrentarán el mismo rechazo que él, Jesús ora para que estén a salvo "del maligno." La comunidad de Juan está experimentando pruebas, y estas palabras de Jesús sirven como una fuente de consuelo para ellos.

Para reflexionar: ¿Si creo en que el mandamiento del amor es primero que todos los demás? ¿Qué podemos hacer como iglesia para ayudar a lograr el deseo de Jesús de que "seamos uno?" ¿Es lo mismo unidad que uniformidad?
