## **Spiritual Notes:**

The reading from Genesis today narrates the creation of the woman as "a suitable partner for" the man because, God declares, "it is not good for the man to be alone." After creating "various wild animals and various birds" and presenting them to man, the Lord God realizes that none of them is adequate. This leads to the decision to form a woman from "one of his ribs." This new creation finally proves to be "the suitable partner for the man." The writer of the Letter to the Hebrews speaks of how Jesus "for a little while" was made "lower than the angels." In sharing our humanity, the Word consecrates us through His suffering as He brings "many children to glory."

The Pharisees in today's Gospel seek Jesus' view on divorce. In Jesus' day, there were various schools of thought: Judaism based its permission to divorce on the word of Moses, but only the husband could initiate a divorce; Roman law permitted a wife to divorce her husband as well. Jesus' statement concerning a wife divorcing her husband indicates that Mark's text is addressed to non-Jewish audience. The early church evidently had an evolving opinion about divorce, for we see Jesus forbidding it in Mark and Luke, but in Matthew's text, Jesus allows it in certain cases. Divorce continues to be an issue today, as illustrated by the discussions leading up to this month's Synod on the Family in Rome. For Jesus and His church, there are two points of concern: God's intention for marriage, and the reality of broken relationships.

*For reflection: How can I help foster healthy relationships among those who are married? The Bible presents man and woman as equals. Do I accept this view?*

### Immaculate Conception School Students Respond to the Challenge

Students at Immaculate Conception School surpassed their goal and collected 1,629 items for the 922 Food Drive to benefit the Twin City Christian Association Food Pantry. The Immaculate Conception project was part of a community-wide campaign by Twin City organizations to stock the food pantry that feeds hundreds of people every month. The food drive is held in conjunction with 922 Days sponsored by Truck Sales and Service, Ember Complete Care, First National Bank, Bloom's Printing and local churches and schools. Last year the students collected 848 items. "We are called by God to serve others and I couldn't be more proud of the way our students and families have responded to that call. I think that total is pretty amazing for our little school of 85 students," Ritzert added. Students from pre-school to grade six participated in the drive. In addition to the food, the school received \$120 in cash donations.

#### Notas Espirituales:

El Libro de los Números narra la época de Israel en el desierto. En la lectura de hoy el SEÑOR tomó "del espíritu que reposaba sobre Moisés" y se los dio a "los setenta ancianos." El Señor hace esto en respuesta a las quejas de Moisés, "No puedo llevar a todo este pueblo por mí mismo." Dos de los 70 ancianos en la lista se "habían quedado en el campamento" en vez de salir a "la carpa" (es decir, el tabernáculo), pero incluso ellos recibieron el espíritu y "profetizaron en el campamento." El Señor sigue ofreciendo para el bien de la gente, a pesar de su quejas.

Jacobo les dice una palabra de advertencia a los ricos: "llorarán y se lamentarán sobre sus miserias inminentes." Su delito es que acumulan su riqueza en lugar de ofrecer a los pobres. Pero al igual que el rico insensato en la parábola de Jesús, ellos aprenderán que las riquezas terrenales no duran. El oro y la plata se empaña, y la polilla se come incluso la más fina ropa. Mientras damos la bienvenida al Papa Francisco a los Estados Unidos este fin de semana, estamos llamados a renovar nuestra preocupación por los que van sin causa de la avaricia de los demás. Los gritos de los pobres "han llegado a los oídos del Señor de los ejércitos."

El exorcista "que expulsaba demonios en nombre (de Jesús)" sirve como un recordatorio (haciéndose eco de nuestra primera lectura) que no podemos limitar el espíritu de Dios. "El que no está contra nosotros, está por nosotros," Jesús dice a sus discípulos. Él va a decir que la vida eterna merece la pena a cualquier sacrificio que tenemos que hacer; como el tesoro enterrado o la perla de gran precio que se habla de otra parte, incluso si tenemos que sacrificar una "mano" o un "pie" o un "ojo," el reino de Dios merece el precio.

**Para reflexionar:** ¿Puedo ver el espíritu de Dios actuando en los "setenta ancianos" de la iglesia de hoy? Cómo puedo hacer un esfuerzo para hacer frente a la difícil situación de los pobres?
