Spiritual Notes:

The Book of Proverbs is a textbook for instruction in ancient Israel, bringing together wise sayings that serve as lessons for its people. In today's reading, Wisdom herself speaks. Wisdom personified is part of biblical Israel's way of thinking. Wisdom was "brought forth" while as yet the earth and fields were not made. She was there, when the Lord established the heavens. Wisdoms antiquity establishes her authority and reliability. Predating the universe, she shares in the life of God in a special way. Being beside God during creation, she has an understanding that is unique. We must seek to learn from her. Paul writes to the Romans, reminding them that having "been justified by faith/we have peace with God." This peace is our gift, acquired at the cost of the death of Jesus Christ. Through his death, "we have gained access to God's grace." This is God's gift to us. But we know that with faith comes affliction. Paul and his fellow believers suffer for the sake of the Gospel, but he tells them that it is cause to rejoice because the suffering leads to hope. Paul intends to visit the Church of Rome and knows that he will share in both their joy as well as their affliction. In the Gospel today, Jesus is speaking to His disciples at the Last Supper. He promises them the gift of the "Spirit of truth" who will declare to you the things that are coming. This time in Jesus' life, the time of his suffering, death, and resurrection, is his long awaited "hour." Jesus promises that the Spirit will guide you to all truth, a reminder that revelations is an ongoing process. It is only over time, as is witnessed in the Book of Acts, that the apostles will come to understand Jesus' will for them and his message.

For reflection: Do I strive to achieve wisdom in life, or am I more concerned with knowledge? Can I see how God's word to me is slowly revealed by the Holy Spirit?

Holy Year of Mercy: Fifth Beatitude - "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy." (Mt. 5:7) Mercy is a compassion that seeks to unburden the sorrows and misery of others as if they were our own. Mercy is really a mystery. It

runs counter to our sin-damaged nature. Too often we ignore or are indifferent to the sufferings of others. But Jesus was always merciful to those in sorrow or misery: to Mary Magdalen, to the woman at the well, to Peter who denied him, to Zacchaeus, and even to Judas. His parables were parables of mercy: the good Samaritan, the prodigal son, the lost sheep. The good thief on the cross is a good example of mercy extended and mercy received (Lk. 23:39-43). The good thief showed his mercy in his concern for the selfish thief's spiritual welfare and in his recognition of Jesus' innocence. Jesus returned that mercy. What we overlook about this Gospel passage is that the selfish thief received no mercy. The adage "what you sow, so shall you reap" applies here. Mercy is costly. It cost God the Father His own Son on the cross and Jesus His own life. Even if it is costly to us, it is the only way to begin in trying to overcome evil and sin. God showers us with abundant graces of mercy, if only we will accept and use them as He intends.

Mercy grows within us as we reflect on how God has been merciful to us.

Please remember in your prayers, all the sick, homebound, and recovering in our parish. Also, pray for those coping with physical or mental conditions.



Notas Espirituales:

En la primera lectura, la sabiduría habla como una mujer que estuvo presente desde el comienzo de la creación. Los versículos nos recuerdan la belleza de toda la creación y cómo la sabiduría divina era activo durante todo el génesis, el Salmo 8, como el Salmo responsorial, nos da una oportunidad para proclamar la bondad del Santo Nombre de Dios por su maravillas. La selección de Romanos habla de la "gracia en la cual estamos firmes." Esta es la gracia que nos permite "presumir de nuestras aflicciones" y verlos como un reto a crecer en la fe y la confianza en Dios que es Padre, Hijo y Espíritu. Ninguna de las lecturas de hoy invocan la fórmula trinitaria, sin embargo, el Evangelio nos invita a escuchar el Hijo, que ha actuado igual desde su padre, y enviará el Espíritu de verdad (un regalo que celebramos el domingo pasado).

Liturgia

Las Matemáticas de este misterio de la fe se encuentran profundamente arraigadas en la historia de la Iglesia, cuando los primeros seguidores de Jesús empezaron a desarrollar una nueva comprensión de su identidad y, finalmente, nuestra teología de la Trinidad, una teología que afirma que son tres personas distintas en un solo Dios. Hablamos de las Personas de la Trinidad en forma análoga porque las palabras no pueden capturar el misterio de Padre, Hijo v Espíritu Santo. No hav palabras para expresar la plenitud de la Trinidad, sino que intenta decir lo que el Señor nos ha revelado el misterio de la Trinidad. Cantando "Todos Alaben, y Adoren la Trinidad" sin duda nos abre a la maravilla de la majestad y la incomprensibilidad de Dios inefable. Si bien una homilía puede ser catequética, no es principalmente un tiempo para las lecciones. En este domingo, estamos llamados a ayudar a la asamblea aplicar o ver el misterio de la Santísima Trinidad en sus vidas. Sus palabras pueden llevar a sus feligreses para ver donde está presente y activa en sus vidas, donde se encuentran con el Hijo del Padre, y cuando el Espíritu les ha llamado hacia adelante.
