# **Spiritual Notes:**

The Book of Wisdom speaks today of God's limitless mercy. As creator of the universe, God loves "all things that are," for "what you hated, you would not have fashioned." God brings all things into being and sustains them. For our author, God is incomparable, and our existence is sustained because God "willed it." God's "imperishable spirit" dwells in us, and so we should strive to walk in the way of Wisdom, who is to be our constant companion, guiding us in God's ways. Paul tells the Thessalonians that "we always pray for you" to remain firm in the faith. God's grace can be made manifest in us if we cooperate with it. We must strive to avoid being "shaken out of your minds suddenly" by a contrary gospel. This is apparently a danger for the Thessalonians, who have been told by another party that Jesus' return is imminent. Paul knows better and calls them to remain firm in the faith they received by living lives in which "the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified." As a tax collector working for the Romans, Zacchaeus probably didn't have many friends among his fellow Jews. Jesus originally "intended to pass through" Jericho but his encounter with Zacchaeus led him to alter his plans. Seeing the tax collector in the sycamore tree, Jesus tells him, "Today I must stay at your house." Zacchaeus receives Jesus "with joy" and pledges to make restitution for his sins. As a result of this encounter, "salvation has come to this house." Doing God's work, sometimes means taking a detour from our plans in order to let God's grace work through us. For Reflection: Have I experienced God's limitless mercy in my life? Is there somewhere in my life where I need to make restitution?

# <u>The Jubilee Year of Mercy</u> December 8, 2015-November 20, 2016

Precepts of the Catholic Church. Second Precept: You shall confess your sins at least once a year. "But if we acknowledge our sins, he who is just can be trusted to forgive our sins." (1 Jn. 1:9) Every Catholic must use the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once during the year. Third Precept: You shall receive the sacrament

of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season. That means that every Catholic must be free from mortal sin and in the state of grace when receiving Jesus in the Eucharist during the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Catholic liturgy. (Jn. 6:44-69) Fourth Precept: You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church. Matthew tells us that Jesus "...fasted forty days and forty nights." (Mt. 4:2) Fasting is common in the Old Testament and Jesus passed that tradition on to us. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting for those between the ages of 18 and 59. They may have one full meal and two smaller meals which together is equivalent to one full meal. Abstinence (no meat) is required on Ash Wednesday and every Friday through Good Friday during lent. Fifth Precept: You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church. The faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability. Everything that we have comes from the mercy of God and still belongs to Him. We are stewards of His largess, and He expects us to return some of it in gratitude for His mercy to us.

November 1st and 2nd the Church celebrates the Feast of All Saints and the Feast of All Souls. The "Book of the Dead," to remember those family and friends who have died, are on the table in the Vestibule of the Church. All are invited to write the names of their deceased family members and friends in this book. It will be brought to the Altar as part of the Offertory, at each of the Masses on the weekend of October 29 and 30, 2016, so those names will be remembered in prayer.

## **Notas Espirituales:**

El libro de la Sabiduría habla hoy de la misericordia infinita de Dios. Como creador del universo, Dios ama "todas las cosas que existen y no aborrece nada de lo que ha hecho." Dios hace todas las cosas a la existencia y las sostiene. Para nuestro autor, Dios es incomparable, y nuestra existencia es sostenida por la voluntad de Dios. Espíritu imperecedero" Dios habita en nosotros, y por lo que debe tratar de caminar en el camino de la sabiduría, que ha de ser nuestro compañero constante, nos guía en el camino de Dios.

Debemos luchar para evitar ser "sacudido fuera de sus mentes" por un evangelio contrario. Aparentemente es un peligro para los Tesalonicenses, que se les ha dicho por otra parte que el regreso de Jesús es inminente. Pablo conoce mejor y pide que se mantenga firme en la fe que recibieron de vidas que viven en la cual "el nombre de nuestro Señor Jesús sea glorificado."

Como recaudador de impuestos de trabajo para los Romanos, Zaqueo probablemente no tenía muchos amigos entre sus compañeros judíos. Jesús al principio" la intención de pasar a través de "Jericó, pero su encuentro con Zaqueo lo llevó a cambiar sus planes. Al ver el recaudador de impuestos en el árbol sicómoro, Jesús le dice: "Hoy tengo que hospedarme en tu casa." Zaqueo recibe a Jesús "con alegría" y se compromete a hacer la restitución de sus pecados. Como resultados de este encuentro, "ha llegado la salvación a esta casa." Hacer el trabajo de Dios a veces significa tomar un desvío de nuestros planes con el fin de permitir la gracia de Dios trabajar a través de nosotros.

Para reflexionar: ¿Cómo puedo ser testigo de mi fe? ¿Estoy dispuesto a la propia revelación de Dios en mi vida?
